The roof of an under-construction pump house at a proposed power plant site in Rajshahi collapsed yesterday afternoon, leaving at least nine workers injured.

Fire service officials said they did not find any worker trapped under the debris of the building.

The nine injured, admitted to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital, were rescued from the rubble of the broken down roof.

Two of them were in critical condition. Four others took first aid.

The 50MW power plant at Katakhali under Poba upazila is being implemented by the Power Development Board (PDB) at a cost of Tk 317 crore. It was supposed to begin production in April as almost 80 percent work was done, officials have said.

The incident took place at 4:00pm when the construction workers were carrying out casting work of the roof with

Extortionists rule river route

Idhan Mia has been operating a trawler carrying construction materials from Sunamganj to Dhaka for the last five years. But now he gets scared each time he is hired to navigate a vessel on this river route because of wholesale extortion allegedly by police and local goons.

"On the waterway from Jamalganj in Sunamganj to Kanchpur in Narayanganj, we now often fall victim to extortionists," Idhan told The Daily Star on board his trawler as he watched his workers unloading pebbles.

The extortionists are comprised of

a section of police and goons of different lessees of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authorities (BIWTA), claimed the 25-year-old trawler crew.

His claim was seconded by an association representing the trawler

Idhan said he faced extortionists in the past, but those were stray incidents. What is happening now is a systematic way to rob pebble traders, he added.

He went on to say the extortionists travel by boats at different points of the waterways, cling to boats carrying commercial materials, forcibly climb up on board and start hurling abusive words wielding locally made weapons to collect tolls.



The Election Commission began updating the voter list yesterday.

It will make a complete voter list by December, this year, covering the whole country in four phases.

Enumerators yesterday started visiting from door to door in 64 upazilas, one from each districts of the country. Opening the task at Savar University College, Chief Election Commissioner Kazi Rakibuddin Ahmed urged field level officials to do the job with utmost sincerity.

Enumerators and supervisors have to work hard to ensure that all eligible voters are on the list, the CEC said. "Your [EC officials] negligence in duty may tarnish

He also sought voters' cooperation in making a flawless updated list.

People, who are aged 18 or above now, and those, who will be 18 by January 1 next year, will be registered as voters.

Enumerators will give prospective voters the dates for visiting nearby registration centres to have their photographs and fingerprints taken for the voter list.

While updating the list, they will also collect information about people who have died since the last time the voter list was updated in 2010.

In the capital, the voter list updating will begin in October. Meanwhile, the EC **SEE PAGE 19 COL 8**
