Worker dies in city wall collapse

A female construction worker was killed and her male colleague injured when a wall of a construction site collapsed on them in the city's Adabor yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Mosammat Begum, 45, wife of Shahar Ali Sheikh of Akkasnagar in Mohammadpur Beribadh, while the injured was Babul Miah, 22.

Babul was admitted to Pongu Hospital. According to their co-workers, the boundary wall

collapsed on Mosammat and Babul around 2:30am when they were removing soil in the construction site named Glory Real Estate.

They were rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where Mosammat was declared dead. Mosammat's husband Shahar Ali filed a case against six persons.

Police arrested Nurul Islam, caretaker of the site, and Mohammad Rafiq, a labour leader, in this connection.

Eight Shibir men held in Ctg

The complex, to be set up on the 17 acres of workshop of RHD, will cost an estimated Tk 100 crore. The rest of the amount will be borne by the ministry.


Communications Minister Obaidul Quader said this to reporters at his Secretariat office yesterday.

Omar Faruk, officer-incharge of Tejgaon Industrial Police Station, told The Daily Star that former husband of the deceased, Manik Miah, stabbed in the chest, hand and back of Sumi while she was on her way to residence around 1:00pm.

Sumi was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where doctors declared her dead at 2:00pm.

Locals caught Manik Miah and handed him over to police. Manik claimed himself as her husband, police said.

Prime minister urges dev partners

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday stressed the need for inspiring and motivating the developed and developing world to take lead in taking people-oriented mitigation and adaptation programmes to cope with the adverse impacts of climate change. She said this while speaking at the

inaugural session of the 3-day Meeting of Parliamentarians on "Climate Change: Beyond COP 17" at Hotel Radisson in the capital.

Sheikh Hasina also called for deeply analysing the adverse impacts of the climate change to ensure happiness, peace and prosperity of the people.

She underscored the need for crafting a legally binding agreement on emissions reduction without any delay, based on the principle of common and differentiated responsibilities. She added: "In support of our efforts,

partners to help us with adequate finance, technology and capacity development support." The prime minister held the industrialised countries responsible for remaining

insensitive to the predicament of the poorer and vulnerable countries in the face of climate change impacts. Expressing her concern, she said: "We see no clarity on how the global community would raise funds in the period between 2013 and 2020 for mak-

ing the 'Green Climate Fund' operational. We also do not see any mechanism for transfer of green technology to the developing countries for mitigation and adaptation purposes."

The prime minister also called upon the developed world to consider these


Mohammad Mahmudur Rahman, chairperson of the department, has urged the well-off people of society to extend their help to save Zinnah from being paralysed.

Japan to provide \$6.28 lakh for human security

Japan will provide US \$ 628,000 as grant for seven grassroot projects in Bangladesh on human security encompassing healthcare services to mothers, children and physically challenged people and arsenic mitigation.

Japanese Ambassador to Bangladesh Shiro Sadoshima signed the grant for three of the projects with representatives of the three respective implementing organisations at the Embassy of Japan yesterday.

The three projects would be implemented by Centre for the Rehabilitation of the Paralysed (CRP), Arsenic Mitigation and Research Foundation (AMRF) and Unitarian Service for Development and Peace (USDP).

Four other organisations, to implement the remaining four projects, will sign the grant on March 18, says a press release of the embassy.

CRP will use its share of the grant, US \$ 102,082, to construct a four-storied "Rehabilitation Centre" in Rajshahi.

This centre will help physically challenged people access healthcare and therapeutic services, including physiotherapy, occupational, speech and language therapy, orthotics and prosthetics. It is expected to rehabilitate 23,440 people while providing vocational training to 100 people per year.

AMRF will use its share, US\$ 86,208, to construct a two-storied hospital for mothers and children in Munshiganj, which expects to serve 15,700 seekers of maternal and neonatal healthcare per year.

USDP will use US \$ 97,539 it is getting to construct a one-storied hospital, capable of providing emergency reproductive and child healthcare services, for people of the minority community of Barguna district.

DoE orders removal of dam on Dhaleshwari

Fines sand traders Tk 2 lakh

The Department of Environment (DoE) penalised seven sand traders, seized an excavator and snapped power supply to a factory in separate drives in Manikganj and Narayanganj

The department fined the sand traders Tk 2 lakh for constructing a road on Dhaleshwari river by illegally setting up a dam on the river at Gheor upazila in Manikganj.

It also ordered the traders, Baten Mia, Farid, Kaisar, Sajid Mia, Abdur Rahim Khan, Md Shahid Khan and Md Liton Mia, to remove the dam by 1:00pm today and to pay the fine as compensation for causing environmental damage, says a press release of DoE.

In another drive, the DoE snapped gas and power connections of Madina Dyeing Factory at Fatullah in Narayanganj for secretly resuming operations at its factory, which was shut by the department on January for polluting Shitalakhya river.

The DoE, in another drive in the district, seized an excavator of Unique Properties for carrying out land development work for a housing project at Bhatiband village in Sonargaon without any environment clearance certificate.
