JS body slams BTRC

The parliamentary standing committee on the telecom ministry yesterday alleged that the telecom regulator itself has spoiled the investment environment in the sector.

For the last two years, Bangladesh Telecommunication Regulatory Commission (BTRC), the regulator, has been working on mobile licence renewal but has not been able to complete the process yet. Irked by its bureaucratic procrastinations, the operators went to court, the committee alleged.

At yesterday's meeting, both the parliamentary committee members and the telecom ministry officials accused BTRC of creating hindrances to the telecom sector.

Zia Ahmed, BTRC chairman, was present at the meeting along with other officials. Sunil Kanti Bose, telecom secretary, said the telecom

operators lost appetite for further investment as licence renewal for four companies got stuck in a rut. The operators are going to court frequently and the renewal process is still pending, Bose said.

The BTRC is piling pressure on the operators in the name of generating revenues, while other state agencies oversee the revenue-related matters, Bose said in the meeting.

He also said, due to the regulatory environment the sector has become uncertain and it is no more in a flourishing condition.

However, the BTRC chairman said the regulator did not go to the court, rather the operators did so, which has delayed the renewal process.

As the court will give decision on licence renewal, the BTRC has nothing to do with this, he said. While talking to The Daily Star last night, Ahmed said the renewal process will not obstruct investment of the operators.

Money transfer made simpler

IT freelancers to get fast money from abroad as Bank Asia teams up with AlertPay on e-payment

IT freelancers and exporters will now receive their payments from foreign buyers without any hassle, as AlertPay yesterday made foray into Bangladesh by launching online payment service in partnership with Bank Asia Ltd.

The tie-up with the Canada-based firm has helped the local bank become Bangladesh's first financial institution to introduce an easy online payment gateway service that analysts say will revolutionise ecommerce in the country.

Bangladesh Bank Governor Dr Atiur Rahman inaugurated the service at Hotel Purbani in the city.

The service, first of its kind in Bangladesh, will allow the country's growing IT freelancers to bring their dollars deposited in the accounts with AlertPay in any of their bank accounts in the country through Bank Asia at a low cost.

Md Mehmood Husain, president and managing director of Bank Asia, said a huge number of youth are now earning foreign currencies through outsourcing as freelancers.
