### Nor'wester injures 25

Nor'wester lashed ten villages of Kalmakanda upazila in the district yesterday morning injuring 25 people and damaging houses, boro paddy and uprooting trees. The worst affected villages are Bottola, Bhasankura, Adaahipa, Hat-Gobindapur, Kharnai, Baruakona, Bogadubi, Kurakhali, Biswanathpur and Ranigaw. The storm also damaged Hat-Gobindapur market, administration sources said. During the 30-minute storm Roti Mohon Hajong, Rani Hajong of village Bhasankura, Nurul Islam and Fatema Begum of village Kurakhali were seriously injured.

## 15 houses gutted in Pabna

Fire incidents gutted at least 15 in Basherbanda village of Ishwardi upazila and Bothor village of Chatmohar upazila on Saturday. Sources said, a devastating fire damaged 10 houses of Basherbanda village at noon. The fire originated from a stove of Md. Salim Uddin of the village and spread to adjoining 10 houses. ## Drug addict kills father

A man killed his father at Gazipur village in Benapole municipal area early yesterday for refusal to give money for buying drugs. The deceased was identified as Abdus Sattar, 65, of Gazipur village. Officer in-charge at Benapole port police station Hasan Hafizur Rahman said, accused Jobayer Ahmed is a drug addict. As his father refused to give the money, Jobayer hit him with a stick on his head at about 3:30am, leaving him dead on the spot. Neighbours caught Jobayer while he was trying to flee the scene and handed him over to police.

## Two arrested with arms

# Rice mill owner abducted, two girls go 'missing'

A rice mill owner was abducted in Jessore while two teenage girls went missing in Jhenidah on Saturday.

Armed criminals in Jessore abducted a rice mill owner at Kamlapur in Chowgacha upazila on Saturday night.

The victim was identified as Kamruzzaman Kakon, son of Bakul Mia of Andulia village in the upazila, reports our correspondent.

Witnesses said the criminals waylaid Kakon while returning home on a motorbike and forcibly took him into their microbus at about 10pm and fled the scene hurriedly.

Victim's father Bakul Mia filed a case with local police station

According to the victim's family, Kakon and Humayun Kabir Swapon of Sukhpukuria village had a long-standing conflict.

Kakon filed general diary against Swapon on charge of extortion a few days back.

Swapon might have abducted Kakon because of the case, Bakul Mia alleged.

In Jhenidah, two students of Jhenidah Government Girls' school went missing after joining a rally on Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's birth anniversary on

Saturday.

Jhenidah Sadar police station duty officer Akinur Rahman said, the girls, both 13, of Power House Para went out of home in the morning. At noon, two family members of the girls filed general diaries (GDs) with the PS.

Relatives said they found no trace of the girls after searching every possible places. They might have been

# Enclave people on hunger strike

Enclave people went on an indefinite hunger strike in Boda upazila of Panchagarh district yesterday to press home their three-point demand including immediate implementation of India-Bangladesh land boundary agreement of 1974, popularly known as Indira-Mujib Pact.

They also demanded a definite timeframe to implement the enclave exchange deal.

People from all 111 Indian enclaves inside Bangladesh took part in the strike hold beside Dhaka-Panchagarh Highway near Puthimari Indian enclave.

Leaders of India-Bangladesh Enclave Exchange Coordination Committee called the programme at a press conference in the district town on Saturday afternoon. Enclave leader Sirajul Islam read out a written statement.

The leaders said they were frustrated as no timeframe was mentioned yet in the deal, signed during Manmohan Singh's visit to Bangladesh in September last year.

They also said that the enclave people are living in awful conditions amid lack of adequate employment opportunity, infrastructure, educational institutions, electricity and medical

facilities. They urged both the governments to implement the deal as soon as possible considering the enclave people's miserable life without citizens' rights.

Chairman of Puthimari Indian enclave Toslimuddin, chairman of Garati Indian enclave Mofizer Rahaman and chairman of Kajoldighi Indian enclave, were present at the conference.

According to a recently conducted joint survey of the two countries, Bangladesh has 51 enclaves comprising around 3,000

acres of adversely possessed lands inside India while India has 111 enclaves comprising 3,500 acres of such land inside Bangladesh.

Indian enclaves inside Bangladesh are situated in Panchagarh, Lalmonirhat, Kurigram and Nilphamari districts while all of the Bangladeshi enclaves are in Indian Cooch Behar district.
