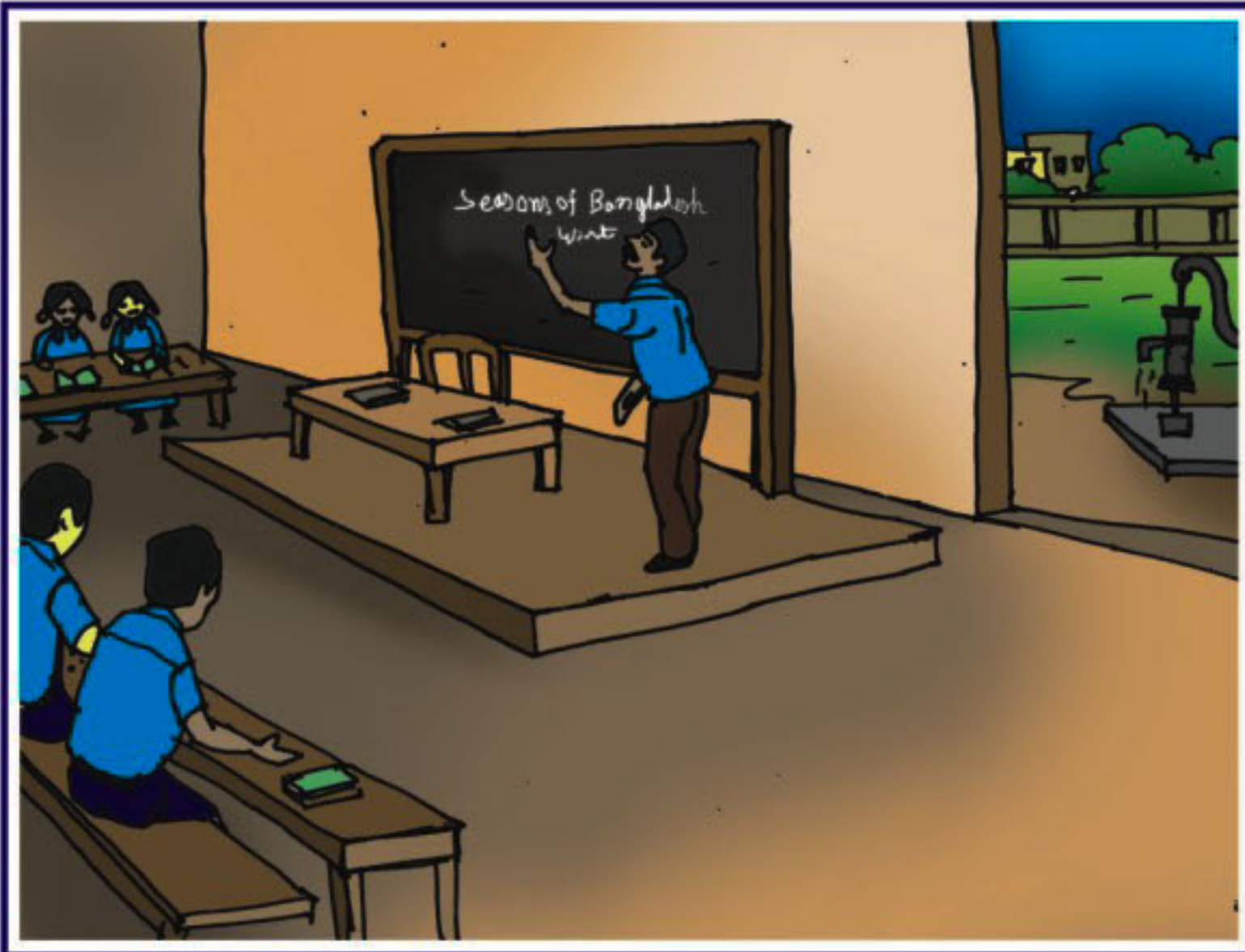

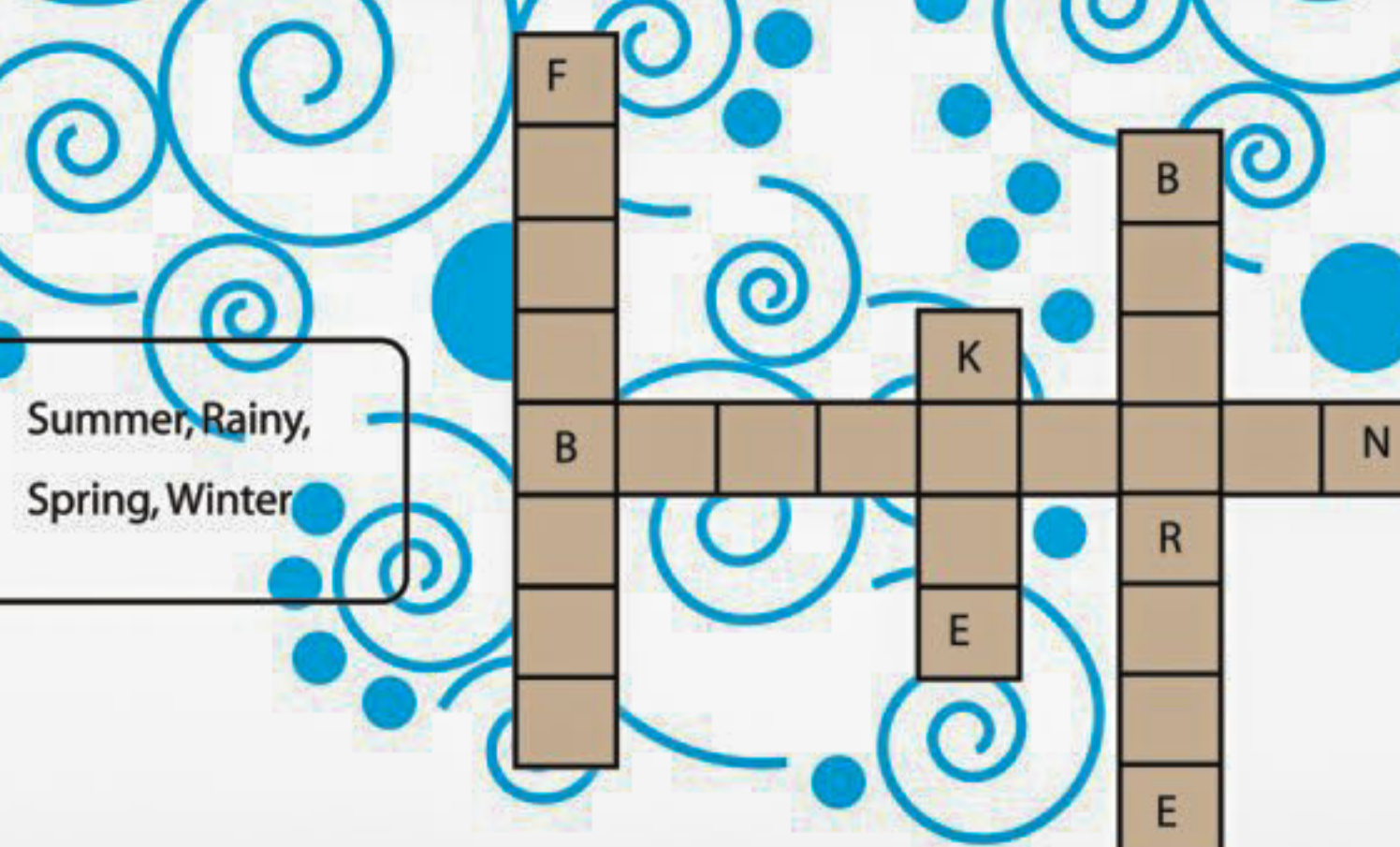
These are my instructions for going on a trip in summer
