Freed UK journos leave Libya for home

Two British journalists detained by a Libyan militia a month ago and accused of spying left Tripoli for the United Kingdom yesterday after being cleared of all charges.

Nicholas Davies-Jones and Gareth Montgomery-Johnson, who were working for Iran's English-language Press TV, were detained on February 22 by the Swehli brigade, one of dozens of militias which last year helped force out Libyan leader Muammar Gaddafi.

Earlier this month, the Swehli militia said the Britons, initially detained for entering Libya illegally, were suspected of spying. Both men were transferred to government custody last week and were released on Sunday after charges were dropped.

The tenor of the talks was set off by Yahya, who was indignant over the fact that on the preceding day Bangalee civilians had blocked the movement of troops in Joydevpur, which had led to violence. He made it a point to let Mujib know that he was trying hard to find a way out of the
