spread Islamic militancy in the country under the banned organisation.
Mostaq has been leading the banned outfit Purb Banglar Communist Party (Red flag), Bagmara unit, Rab sources said.
According to a press release issued by Rab yesterday, a team of Rab-5 on information raided Goalkandi village around 2:45am when a gang of outlaws were holding a meeting there for committing "subversive activities".
Seeing the Rab members, the gang started firing on them. The Rab men fired back and at one stage the outlaws, except for Mostaq who was bullet hit, managed to flee.
He was rushed to the

upazila health complex where doctors declared him dead, the press release says. At least 15 bullets were exchanged during the gunfight, Rab said in the press release.
Rab claimed that two of its members had also been injured and admitted to a local hospital.
Following the incident, two Pakistan-made revolvers, 12 bullets, a single-barrel gun, three machetes, eight bullet shells, a magazine and 12 bottles of phensedyl were recovered from the scene, Rabsaid.
Mostaq, a resident of Polashi village and a marriage registrar by profession, was an accused in eight criminal cases including four filed for murders.
He had joined JMB in

2004 as an aide to the leader of the banned organisation Bangla Bhai. Rab officials said Mostaq had served as the operations commander of JMB's Bagmara unit.
Activities of BPCP were scaled down in Bagmara following the deaths of its regional commanders Ratan alias Titas and Elahi Bux Mithu in separate shootouts in 2010. But Rab's intelligence unit has recently learnt that some members of the outfit under the leadership of Mostaq have been reorganising the group, according to the press release.
It also says Bangla Bhai, who had tortured several people to death and maimed many in 2004, had often stayed at the house of Mostaq.

Mojaheed charged

In another incident, Shahid Sirajuddin Hossain, executive editor of the daily Ittefaq in 1971, was abducted by a group of people. The prosecutor said the abduction was "controlled" and "directed" by the Jamaat leader.
The veteran pro-liberation journalist was never to be seen again. His body was never found, he added.
The prosecution yesterday finished reading out the 109-page formal charges against Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojaheed, secretary general of Jamaat-e-Islami. It also finished its arguments supporting the charges brought against him.
The tribunal, led by its Chairman Justice Md Nizamul Huq, adjourned the hearing until March 22. Mojaheed's defence counsels were supposed to begin their arguments regarding the charges on that day.
After hearing the defence's arguments, the tribunal would decide whether it would frame charges against Mojaheed.
The Secretary General of Jamaat-e-Islami was produced before the court yesterday. He is facing 32 charges of crimes against humanity during the Liberation War.
Five other Jamaat and two BNP leaders are also facing war crimes charges at the tribunal.
Reading out the charges against Mojaheed, prosecutor Rana Dasgupta said Altaf Mahmud, a renowned music composer, Rumi, Azad, Bodiul Alam Bodi, Jewel and Jahiruddin Ahmed Jalal were confined to the army camp in Dhaka's Nakharpura during the war.
"On August 30, 1971, Mojaheed and Motiur Rahman Nizami visited that camp," said Rana. Motiur Rahman Nizami, ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami, is also facing war crimes charges at the tribunal.
"They saw the prisoners

and badmouthed them. They told the Pakistani army officers that the prisoners must be killed before the president announced a general amnesty."
Five of them were killed. Jahiruddin Ahmed Jalal was the only survivor who managed to escape with injuries, the prosecutor added.
On December 10, 1971, a group of seven to eight people carrying rifles went to the Chamelibagh house in the capital of Sirajuddin Hossain. Sirajuddin was taken away on a minibus and never to be seen again.
"The accused [Mojaheed] controlled and directed the abduction," said Rana Dasgupta. Sirajuddin Hossain had written an article describing the atrocities committed by Pakistani soldiers. This made him a target of Jamaat, the prosecutor added.
According to the prosecutor, Mojaheed was also directly involved with the mass murder of 50 to 60 people in the Hindu dominated villages of Baidyadangi, Majhidangi and Baladangi in Faridpur.
He along with eight to 10 Pakistani soldiers surrounded the villages and set over 300 houses ablaze, according to the charges.
Other charges brought against the Jamaat leader include delivering anti-liberation statements in different programmes and newspapers and frequently visiting Pakistani army and Razakar camps, including the Physical Training

Institute camp in Mohammadpur in the capital.
Mojaheed and former Jamaat-e-Islami ameer Ghulam Azam allegedly visited the camp frequently to plan and conspire against pro-liberation forces. The killings of intellectuals and other atrocities were committed from that camp, the prosecutor said.
NO NAMES OF INTELLECTUALS
At one point during yesterday's proceedings, the tribunal asked the prosecution why the charges do not mention names of any intellectuals who were killed during the Liberation War in 1971 even though the killings were mentioned in a general context.
"You mentioned the killings of intellectuals and yet you did not mention anyone's name?" said Justice ATM Fazle Kabir, a judge of the tribunal.
Rana said, "The witnesses would tell the names in their statements in due course of time."
The matter, however, came up once again just before the tribunal was about to end the proceedings at 3:38pm. "It is really a touchy matter, and yet there are no names," said Justice Fazle Kabir.
Prosecutor Rana replied that a separate investigation is being conducted to identify members of the "killing squad" who took part in the murders. The prosecutor later read out the name of a

few intellectuals who were killed during the war.
SAYEDEE'S TRIAL
Prosecutor Syed Haider Ali yesterday through an application to the court asked for prosecution witnesses' statements to the investigation agency to be considered as their depositions to the court.
Haider yesterday explained the prosecution's future course of action regarding witness testimonies against Jamaat leader Delwar Hossain Sayedee, as directed by the tribunal on Sunday.
Haider later told the media that the prosecution explained the situation with prosecution witnesses against Sayedee.
He said they mentioned that Jamaat-e-Islami men have threatened some witnesses. As a result, the witnesses fled their villages in Pirojpur.
Another witness, who is 78 years old, is seriously ill and cannot travel at all, said the prosecution, adding that the prosecution also heard that some other witnesses have fled to India.
So, the prosecution has appealed to the tribunal to accept the witness statements from the investigation report as their deposition, he added.
Mizanul Islam, a defence counsel of Sayedee, said the application was "dangerous" and the defence needs some time to prepare for placing arguments on it.
The tribunal fixed March 25 for hearing the arguments.

WAR CRIMES India ready to back UN vote on Lanka

Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh on Monday said India is "inclined" to vote in favour of a resolution against Sri Lanka at the UN Human Rights Council.
The council is due to vote later this week on a US motion calling for a probe into alleged war crimes in Sri Lanka as its civil war ended in 2009.
Both government forces and Tamil Tiger rebels have been accused of abuses.
Manmohan has come under pressure from India's Tamil community to support the resolution.
The Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) party, representing Tamils in southern India, had threatened to pull out of the coalition led by Manmohan's Congress party if India did not vote in favour.
Speaking in parliament, Manmohan said, "We are inclined to vote in favour of the resolution if the resolution will cover our objectives, namely the achievement of a future for the Tamil community in Sri Lanka that is based on equality, dignity, justice and self respect."
He said India would study the final text of the draft resolution once it had been received.

Reckless they all are

inaugurating a three-day workshop on enhancing drivers' skills and awareness organised by the Dhaka Transport Coordination Board (DTCB) at its office in the capital's Nagar Bhaban.
The minister's comment came after distasteful comments of lawmakers in parliament made on Sunday and Monday.
"We, who are assuming the driving seats of the country's politics, are reckless like reckless drivers. If we the lawmakers break laws, how will people obey the laws?" he said.
He also urged the public representatives and lawmakers to change their mentality and protect

democracy.
Admitting that the government is far behind in gaining significant achievements to reduce traffic jam and accidents, he directed the officials related to road communication and road transport sector to work sincerely to end public sufferings.
"Our law enforcement capacity is weak because law enforcers remain busy dealing with political programmes. This is one of the major causes of indiscipline in the traffic system," he said.
He also admitted that there were many risky turns and speed bumps in highways that often cause accidents.
On training of drivers,

the minister directed the DTCB and Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) chiefs to arrange large-scale trainings at bus terminals instead of smaller-scale trainings inside rooms.
Obaidul called upon the drivers not to drive their vehicles recklessly.
DTCB Executive Director M Aftabuddin chaired the function, while BRTA Chairman Aiyubur Rahman, Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation Chairman MM Iqbal, Dhaka Metropolitan Police Joint Commissioner (traffic) Mahbubur Rahman also spoke.
A total of 40 bus drivers were taking part in the workshop.

Short Brief Description of Assignment
icddr,b intends to develop a GIS Application which will include public, NGO and private health facilities providing Maternal, Newborn and Child Health (MNCH) services in 24 districts. The GIS application along with the spatial database would be capable of doing spatial analysis for Health Human Resources (HHR) in the above 24 districts. The HHR database (collected & developed by icddr,b) will encompass all the formal health care providers in different areas of health care services in public, NGO and private sectors at different tiers of health systems (unions, upazilas, districts).

Objective of the proposed assignment:

- Prepare a web-based GIS database for MNCH facilities for 24 districts with provision of online update of the database
