Barca snap up Neymar

Barcelona have sealed a deal which would see talented young Brazilian striker Neymar join the Spanish club in 2014, Cadena SER radio reported.

The report claimed the Catalan giants have already paid 14.5 million euros (\$19 million) of the total 58million-euro transfer fee to the 20-year-old's Brazilian club Santos.

"According to several reliable sources Barca have already paid a quarter of the 58 million euros to Santos to guarantee the transfer of the player," Cadena SER claimed, adding that the date for his transfer was after the World Cup in Brazil in

The report added that the decision to seal the deal was taken by the player and his father against the wishes of his agent Wagner Ribeiro.

"I still think that we won't win the league," added the former Barca and Spain midfielder.

"I am delighted that the fans and the players think we can do it. It's nice to have that hope.

"But it will be very hard to win all 11 games we have left and they (Real) will drop very few points.

Roma gave their outside hopes of a top-three finish in Serie A a shot in the arm on Monday night with a 1-0 win against Genoa thanks to an

early strike from Pablo Daniel Osvaldo.

The Argentine -- returning to the side after a two-match ban -- scored what proved to be the only goal of the game in the third minute to take Roma clear in sixth place with 44 points.

Luis Enrique's side are now four points behind city rivals Lazio, who lie third, and three adrift of both Napoli and Udinese.

Genoa, meanwhile, are 14th with 33 points, seven clear of the relegation zone,

after what was their seventh match without a win.

Roma got off to the perfect start as they sought to build on last weekend's victory at Palermo, with Osvaldo turning away from Marco Rossi and firing past Sebastien Frey into the far corner of the net for his ninth goal of the season.

They dominated the game after that, but were unable to add to their lead, with substitute Bojan Krkic in particular guilty of a glaring miss late on.

But Genoa squandered the two outstanding chances that came their way, Fernando Belluschi being denied by Maarten Stekelenburg from close range in the first half and Rodrigo Palacio hitting the bar from just six yards out after the break.

While Mahmudullah Riyad and Nasir Hossain were steering Bangladesh from a slightly precarious position to the cusp of victory, the eyes of the whole nation were fixated on the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium.

Manchester City will have the chance to revive their faltering bid for the Premier League title as the whole of the English, and indeed

global, game continues to wish Fabrice Muamba well.

There has been a sense of the sport being "on hold" in England since Bolton midfielder Muamba's frightening collapse with a cardiac arrest during last weekend's FA Cup quarterfinal away to Tottenham Hotspur at White Hart Lane.

But although the former England Under-

21 international remains in an intensive care unit, increasingly encouraging medical bulletins regarding his recovery should lessen the understandably sombre mood in the Premier League.

Victory for a City team beaten last time out at Swansea will see then close to within a point of champions and local rivals Manchester United at the top of the table.

Italian manager Mancini must now decide whether Wednesday is the right time to bring back temperamental, if talented, forward Carlos Tevez who went into a self-imposed three-month exile at home in Argentina after falling out with the City supremo in a Champions League clash back in September.

City defender Joleon Lescott insisted the squad would have no problems welcoming back Tevez into first team action.

"He's like a new signing. He's not been injured so he is not going to be struggling too much in terms of sharpness and fitness," Lescott said.

"All the boys are excited and can't wait for him to get playing again," the England international added.

Roberto di Matteo takes a fifth-placed Chelsea side to Eastlands in search of a fifth straight win since he succeeded the sacked AndreVillas-Boas.

Meanwhile Fernando Torres has finally found the net with the Spain striker scoring twice in the 5-2 FA Cup quarterfinal win over Leicester on Sunday to end a goal drought of five months.

The battle for third and fourth, and the Champions League places they bring, is almost as intriguing as the title race.

Arsenal, whose position at one stage this season left many observers


pondering on whether manager Arsene Wenger had been too long at the Gunners are now just a point behind thirdplaced Tottenham and three clear of Chelsea.

They have won their last four games in all competitions and will travel to Everton on Wednesday in confident mood.

Tottenham, who were the team of the season early on, have had a slump of late with three straight league defeats preceding last weekend's Cup tie, abandoned out of respect to Muamba's condition.

Spurs players have all since had heart checks but it is their nerve that will be tested mainly when, in their first match since Muamba took ill, they face Stoke at White Hart Lane on Wednesday.

Meanwhile League Cup winners Liverpool, fresh from booking a second appearance at Wembley this season with an FA Cup quarterfinal win over Stoke, travel to relegation-threatened QPR.
