"It was just a misunderstanding. We'll bear the expenses of his [Ariful's] treatment. Don't take this seriously," said Abdur Razzak, sub-inspector of Tejgaon Police Station. Later, the police team

took the victim for treat-

Alamgir Hossain, who was selling bags just beside scene, said all the hawkers had to pay money to police every day for sitting there.

"Constables Fayez and Abdul Aziz took Tk 40 from me just before they asked money from the chanachur vendor," he alleged.

Contacted, Tejgaon Police Station Officer-incharge Mahbubur Rahman said, "The allegation of demanding extortion is not true. Police drove out the vendors, as they have no right to sell goods on the footpath of VIP a road. He [Ariful] was hurt during a scuffle."

"Forming a new wage board three and a half years after the seventh wage board award will put the newspaper industry into a big crisis," Noab said in a statement on Monday, urging the government to reconsider the matter.

But the leaders of the associations described the Noab statement as a "violation of related laws and also a punishable offence," said a press release of Bangladesh Sangbadik Sramik Karmachari Oikya Parishad (SSKOP).

Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ), Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ), Bangladesh Sangbadpatra Press Sramik Federation and Bangladesh Sangbadpatra Karmachari Federation, that are members of SSKOP, jointly made the call on the Noab.

Under the 1974 law, seven wage boards have been formed so far and implemandatory, the journalist leaders said, adding that the owners' association in the past was compelled to implement the wage boards after losing legal battles.

The prime minister has

announced the formation of the eighth wage board realising the rationale for the salary increase of the journalists, press workers and employees of the industry.

Noab's statement opposing the decision is "unacceptable and motivated" at a time when appointment of the board chairman has been finalised and BFUJ Sramik Federation and Karmachari Federation have sent the list of their representatives to the board.

"Taking a stance against the formation of the eighth wage board is a violation of the prime minister's clear direction and it goes against the interest of the journalists and all those working in the industry," the statement

"There is no reason behind their return to parliament but to save their membership," said the leader of the House.

Hasina cited various successes of her previous term as premier from 1996 to 2001, and termed it a "golden age" for the nation.

She also described the present government's successes in different sectors since it took over in January 2009.

Referring to the use of indecent and vulgar words in the House, the premier said it is very unfortunate. "We don't want anybody to damage the atmosphere in parliament this way."

She also criticised using indecent remarks about judges.

Hasina was absent for most of the time when Khaleda spoke.

The opposition leader left the House immediately after completing her speech.

Ending a 50-hour discussion, the House last night passed a resolution thanking President Zillur Rahman for his address in the House on January 25. The opposition lawmak-

ers however opposed passage of the resolution and voted against it. They proposed over 1,500 amendments to it.

The speaker adjourned the House sitting till 4:00pm on March 29.

Judge (In-charge) Mohammad Akhteruzzaman passed the order after Abu Sayeed Sohel, deputy tax commissioner of the National Board of Revenue (NBR), filed the case with the Senior Special Judge's Court.

According to the case statement, the duo did not submit their income tax returns for the fiscal years 2008-2009, 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 within the stipulated time even though they had repeatedly been served with notices.

The complainant said the NBR served them notices on January 29, 31 and February 15 this year asking them to submit their income tax returns. But they did not appear before the NBR to explain why they had failed to submit their returns in time.

Even their representatives did not take any steps on their behalf during their absence. Moreover, they did not seek more time for submitting their income tax returns, the complainant alleged.

"India was the world's largest recipient of arms, accounting for 10 percent of global arms imports between 2007 to

2011," the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) said on Monday in its latest report. The four next largest recipients of arms in the same period were South Korea (6

percent of arms transfers), Pakistan (5 percent), China (5 percent) and Singapore (4 percent). The figures were not surprising given India's huge reliance on imports, at about 70 percent of its total defence requirements. Since the Kargil conflict of 1999, India has

been steadily buying up arms

and ammunition from foreign suppliers, and has consistently been among the top defence importers of the world. The most visible trend during 2007-11 was how China, which was the largest recipient of arms exports in 2002-2006, fell to fourth position in 2007-11. The decline in

Chinese imports coincided with significant growth of the Asian giant's indigenous arms industry and its rising arms exports, the report said.

"India's imports of major weapons increased by 38 percent between 2002-06 and 2007-11," SIPRI said.

"Notable deliveries of combat aircraft during 2007-11 included 120 Su-30MKs and 16 MiG-29Ks from Russia and 20 Jaguar Ss from the United Kingdom," it said.

"Between 2002-2006 and 2007-11, the volume of Chinese arms exports increased by 95 percent. China now ranks as the sixth largest supplier of arms in the world, narrowly trailing the United Kingdom," SIPRI said.

And the report also noted that Asia leads the world when it comes to weapon imports.

Asia and Oceania accounted for 44 percent of global arms imports, followed by Europe (19 percent), the Middle East (17 percent), the Americas (11 percent) and Africa (9 percent), the think tank said.

international transfers of major conventional weapons was 24 percent higher in the period 2007-11 compared to the 2002-06 period, the report said.

Over the past five years, Asia and Oceania accounted for 44 percent in volume of conventional arms imports, the institute said.
