BCL workers assault student at DU

A group of Bangladesh Chhatra League activists at Dhaka University yesterday assaulted a student before Teachers Students Centre (TSC) as he protested smoking inside bus.

The victim, Mustafizur Rahman Ovi, a third year student of marketing department, suffered injuries in the head and other parts of the body.

Witnesses said Raju Patwary, a first year student of finance department, along with a group of BCL workers clubbed Ovi with iron rods, cricket stamps, and waist belts around 1:30pm.

Sources said Raju was smoking inside a DU bus, Boishaki, which was going towards the campus from Mirpur 14 in the morning.

Photos selected for exhibition Autistic children's numbers

The selection of photographs to be exhibited on the sidelines of "The Daily Star Odommo Chattagram" festival was completed on Tuesday night.

The jury comprised Prof Abul Mansur of Institute of Fine Arts, Chittagong University, noted artiste Shoeb Farooqui, Alliance Française de Chittagong Director Samuel Berthet and photographer Moududul Alam.

The exhibition, to be held at Theatre Institute Chittagong from March 30 to April 5, will bring to light the many talented photographers from home and abroad who tried to capture in images the vibrant port

Shoeb said the organisers received around 650 images from 219 artistes, out of which 121 images were selected for the first phase and from which 80 would be selected for the final round.

Ten images would be awarded at the end of the exhibition, he added.

"We got many photographs on the

natural and scenic beauty of Chittagong but there were very few works on the city or its lifestyles," said Berthet.

The reason, he thinks, is that Chittagong is surrounded by hills, the sea and rivers and the photographers were more captivated by these scenic beauties.

Prof Mansur said there were many young and brilliant photographers in the port city having originality and artistic sense and they found different informed. perspectives of the port city to highlight or focus.

The quality of a photograph was what they first looked for. "Then we considered the aesthetic, technical and compositional values and other dimensions," he said.

Moududul said, "Through the selections we tried to find out Chittagong's rich culture, history and shots, he added.

traditions."

The works also focused on indigenous lifestyles, Boli Khela (wrestling), rituals, and festivals alongside the natural beauties of Chittagong, he said.

"Though we received very few works on the architectural aspects of Chittagong, to me, they (the entrants) were all attentive and devoted to their work," he added.

Around 30 artistes from countries such as India, Afghanistan, the US, Korea, and Singapore, who came to visit the city, submitted the images of the lifestyle and natural beauties of the city they had captured, Shoeb

"I think the exhibition will provide a window of opportunity for the city's photographers to learn how Chittagong looks in a foreigner's eyes," he said.

On the quality of the works, he said, "We are satisfied." They actually found it hard to come down with the selections as everyone submitted their best

The government has launched a survey on children with disabilities, including autism, so that it can take effective measures to improve their lives, Saima Wazed Putul, a school psychologist, said at a meet-the-press yesterday.

The country is still to know how many autistic children are there, and it is a great obstacle to taking steps for providing medication and rehabilitation to these children, she said, stressing collective efforts of government and non-government organisations in this regard.

Ranjit Kumar Biswas, secretary to the social welfare ministry, said the government was to formulate a law, "Rights of the persons with disabilities", as the existing law dealing with challenged people did not completely live up to the expectations of parents of autistic children.

The government has taken a series

of initiatives following the 2011 regional autism conference, convened by Saima Wazed, also daughter of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, said Prof Pran Gopal Datta, vice chancellor of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU).

The government has also involved five ministries--social welfare, education, health, and primary and mass education--to deal the issue compre-

hensively, he said, adding that it also prepared a situation analysis paper to find things to do regarding this.

Prof Datta also said a national advisory committee had also been formed with Saima Wazed as the chairperson, and four projects had been undertaken to conduct schools and render medical facility for autistic children.

Social Welfare Minister Enamul Hoque Mostofa Shaheed said the guardians of autistic children often hide the disability, fearing social stigma and making survey difficult to conduct.

The speakers unanimously laid emphasis on creating awareness on autism, which is a complex developmental disability and has no medical cure. However, if detected early, it can be controlled and improved through therapy, proper teaching, they said.

State Minster for Women and Children Affairs Shirin Sharmin Chowdhury, among others, attended the press conference held at BSMMU.

Biman officials threaten strike

Demand resignation of chairman, directors

Biman Bangladesh Airlines is heading towards a stalemate as officials and staffs, demonstrating for immediate resignation of chairman and all members of Biman board of directors, threatened yesterday to go for indefinite strike if their demands were not met by March 26.

The warning came at a sit-in by several hundred agitated officials and employees of the national flag carrier at Biman's head office at Balaka Bhaban in the city from 11:00am to 1:00pm.

Under the banner of "Biman Bachao Oikya Parishad," seven trade unions of Biman demanded that Biman's Chairman and board members resign immediately taking liability of what they claimed as Tk 1,000 crore loss that Biman incurred due to inefficiency of the current board.

Meanwhile, sources said the Biman chairman met with the prime minister few days back and sought her interference to resolve the stalemate. The sources also said, after Biman Chairman Air Marshal

(retd) Jamal Uddin Ahmed returns from Saudi Arabia at this month's end, a decision may be taken whether the current board will be dissolved or not.

On Tuesday, Jamal Uddin had to cancel five free Biman tickets and purchase those to fly to Jeddah with his four family members for performing Umrah there.
