Bangladesh Public Service Commission (PSC) yesterday published the provisional results of the 32nd BCS (special) preliminary test held on March 9 this year.

The successful candidates are eligible to participate in BCS (Bangladesh Civil Service) written test, says a press release. Results can be found at PSC website: www.bpsc. gov.bd

Besides, one can also get the results by sending an SMS from any mobile phone operator. For this, one has to type BCS < space > 32 < space > reg no. and then send to 16222. The result will be sent in a return message.

The qualified candidates from Dhaka centre can collect the original application forms from the PSC secretariat new office Bhaban at Plot-27 and 29, Agargaon, Sher-e-Bangla Nagar, Dhaka (beside Statistics Bhaban). They have to present the admit cards used for the preliminary test.

The qualified candidates from Chittagong, Rajshahi, Khulna, Barisal and Sylhet centres can collect the application forms from the PSC offices in the respective divisional cities.

The forms will be distributed from April 1 to April 15 between 10:00am and 4:00pm on working days. The applications have to be submitted by April 15.

Beware of plot against war crimes trial: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday urged all religious-minded people to beware of any conspiracy against the trial of the war criminals.

"A certain quarter is hatching conspiracy to foil the trial of war criminals. I urge all religious-minded people to beware of any conspiracy designed to obstruct the trial of the war criminals," she told a programme at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre in the city.

The event was organised to mark the 37th founding anniversary of the Islamic Foundation.

Hasina said during the 1971 Liberation War, Pakistani occupation forces and their allies in Bangladesh had trampled the ideals of Islam, as their deeds did not match with the teachings of Islam -- the religion of peace.

The government has taken steps to bring the perpetrators of the crimes against humanity to justice, she added. "Those who polluted Islam, the religion of peace, must face the trial and it must be ensured."

She said after assuming the office, the present government has taken various steps for spreading Islam. These steps include renovation of mosques; Eidgahs and graveyards; setting up of 2,000 new libraries at mosques; and distribution of 5,000 books.

Some one million students are getting education from mosque-based children and mass education programme each year, she mentioned adding, around 1,536 resource centres are operating to monitor these activities. Besides, three million students are receiv-

ing education under pre-primary, easy-Quran teaching and adult education programmes. Works on digitizing the holy Quran in Arabic along with Bangla and English translations are going on, maintained the premier. Earlier, the PM distributed prizes and

crests among the winners of competitions in different categories. The contests were organised marking the founding anniversary of the Islamic Foundation. State Minister for Religious Affairs Md Shahjahan Miah presided over the programme.

Strong political will and people's participation are imperative to ensure justice in a court, which tries war criminals, an international crimes tribunal expert said yesterday. "It's not easy to get justice in a war crimes court. Moreover

political determination, people's participation, necessary evidence are very important", said Richard J Rogers. He was speaking at a commemorative meeting titled

"International crimes and significance of the war criminals trying process in Bangladesh" at the city's Liberation War Museum.

Rogers, who was chief of the defence team in the war crimes tribunal in Cambodia, said lawyers involved in trial processes must be careful so that witnesses could place evidence properly before the tribunal and were not influenced anyway. "Getting eye-witnesses in the war crimes cases is not easy. And in many cases, getting satisfactory information is also tough", he said.

About the war crimes trial in Bangladesh, he said that though it started after 40 years, the trial process had come a long way, and it had taken a solid shape at present.

Now the trial process should be taken ahead effectively, he added.

Why power plant near Sundarbans?

HC asks govt to explain STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The High Court yesterday asked the government to explain in two weeks why it should not be directed not to set up the proposed 1,300 megawatt coal-fired power plant in Rampal upazila of Bagerhat near the Sundarbans.

The ruling came following a writ petition that says if the plant is set up at Sapmari-Katakhali Mouja of Rampal, the world's largest mangrove forest and its biodiversity will be damaged. Sheikh Siddique Ahammed, organising secretary of environmentalist organisation Save the Sundarbans, filed the petition on January 31 as public interest litigation.

Secretaries to the ministries of planning, environment and forest, energy and mineral resources, and land, the director general of environment department, the chairman of Power Development Board, the deputy commissioner of Bagerhat and project director of the proposed plant have been made respondents to the rule.
