

A. We all know about "Ekushey February" and its importance. This day also reminds us of the martyrs who gave their lives to give us the right to use Bangla, our mother tongue. Here is a story of the life of one of those martyrs.

He was born at Panchua in Mymensingh in 1919. He had his primary education in a local school, but could not continue because he was too poor. (a)..... he left school and helped his father with agricultural work. At fifteen he left home for Narayanganj in search of fortune. There he met an Englishman who helped him to get a job in Myanmar. (b)..... he learned English language there and returned home after twelve years.

On the 20th of February, 1952, he came to Dhaka with his wife and sick mother-in-law who was a cancer patient. He admitted her into Dhaka Medical College Hospital, and was close by when on the 21st February 1952, there was a gathering of the students. There was a procession demanding recognition of Bangla as one of the state languages of Pakistan and he joined the rally. (c)..... the police fired on the procession, and he was hit. He died in the Medical College Hospital the following night. (d)..... in recognition of his sacrifice, he was awarded the Ekushey Padak (an honour bestowed on someone for great deed) in 2000.

Are calling me.



Rafiq with a bouquet of flowers


