


Inter sack Ranieri

Inter Milan sacked coach Claudio Ranieri on Monday after a string of poor results which has left the Serie A giants struggling to qualify for next season's Champions

The former Chelsea and Valencia handler who has guided the side that won the treble including the Champions League in 2010 to just one win in their last 10 league games - has been replaced by youth team coach Claudio Stramaccioni.

The final straw for Inter president Massimo Moratti and the board came with the 2-0 defeat at Juventus on Sunday leaving them in eighth in Serie A.



Spin rules 2nd day

England bounced back after being spun out cheaply by Sri Lanka to leave the first cricket Test evenly poised at the Galle International Stadium on Tuesday.

At the end of an eventful second day's play in which 17 wickets tumbled on a slow pitch, Sri Lanka led the tourists by 209 runs with five second innings wickets in hand. Left-arm spinner Rangana Herath

grabbed six wickets as England were bowled out for 193 in their first innings after skipper Mahela Jayawardene's 180 had lifted Sri Lanka to 318 earlier in the day.

But the hosts slumped to 84-5 in their second knock, four of those wickets falling to off-spinner Graeme Swann, to set up a thrilling finale.

Swann, who had failed to take a wicket in the first innings, ripped through the toporder in the final session of play.

At stumps, Dinesh Chandimal was unbeaten on 17 and Suraj Randiv was on two.

England lasted just 46.4 overs as the world's number one Test side, still to recover from a 3-0 thrashing by Pakistan in the United Arab Emirates earlier this year, once again fumbled against spin.

Ian Bell top-scored with 52, but England lost their way before defiant batting by the tailenders pushed the total from a shaky 92-6.

Stuart Broad smashed 28 in a 30-run partnership for the seventh wicket with Bell, taking 18 runs in four balls from seamer Suranga Lakmal that included three boundaries and a six.

Swann's 24 runs came from six fours and England's tail prospered further when James Anderson (23 not out) and Monty Panesar (13) put on 36 runs for the last wicket.

England will slip to number two behind South Africa in the official rankings if they lose the two-Test series.

The tourists lost opener Alastair Cook in the second over of the innings before a run had been scored when he was trapped legbefore by Lakmal.

Jonathan Trott and captain Andrew Strauss put on 40 for the second wicket, before both fell in successive overs from Herath.

Trott was stumped for 12 and found himself knocked to the ground after colliding with celebrating wicketkeeper Prasanna Jayawardene. Strauss departed in Herath's next over for

26, given out leg-before by the TV umpire after on-field official Asad Rauf turned down a loud appeal by the Sri Lankans. Kevin Pietersen failed to add to his lunch

score of three when he was bowled off the inside edge of the bat by an incoming delivery from seamer Chanaka Welegedara.

Earlier, Sri Lanka added 29 runs to their overnight score of 289-8 before being dismissed 30 minutes after the start of play.

Anderson finished with a five-wicket haul when he ended Mahela Jayawardene's 394minute knock through a catch by wicketkeeper Prior.

The Sri Lankan captain hit 22 boundaries and three sixes in his 30th Test century which helped the hosts recover from a disastrous **SEE PAGE 17 COL 1**

Old DOHS and Victoria Sporting Club have to pick up wins in today's Premier Super League matches but are up against teams that have reasons to keep them at bay.

The Abahani-Victoria game, to be held at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium, promises to be yet another cracker after their rivalry in the first part of the competition. It was a classic at the same venue in which the Motijheel outfit prevailed in a see-saw battle.

It won't be easy for Old DOHS, the league leaders with 18 points, as they take on Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club at the Fatullah Cricket Stadium. Sheikh Jamal are having the better bargain of the momentum scale after they beat Victoria by nine runs in a high-scoring game on March 25.

Defending champions Abahani are on twelve points from eleven games after being defeated by Gazi Tank but the Sky Blues would like to avenge the loss to Victoria back in January which their fans took to heart.

Gazi Tank, who are level on points with Victoria with 16 points from eleven games, take on Mohammedan Sporting Club at the BKSP in Savar. The erstwhile giants are the giantkillers in this year's Premier League, a fine showing for a team that is quite behind in the spending stakes.

Meanwhile, Pakistan batsman Mohammad Yousuf will be playing for Victoria while it is likely that Abahani will go into the game without any foreigners. The former Pakistan captain, who has played 90 Tests and 288 ODIs in a 12-year international career, will add to the batting firepower that includes Shakib Al Hasan and Jahurul Islam.

It will be the second club that Yousuf will be playing for in the Dhaka league after his participation for Mohammedan a few seasons ago.

The 32nd Inter District Cricket Championship will kick off today at different venues across the country.

The top two teams from two groups will play in the final.

Rahmatganj MFS, on the other hand, slipped to the bottom on goal difference only five points from six matches. After a nine-day break, the professional


football league rolled into the field but the battle of the two bottom teams could hardly impress a couple of hundreds spectators.

After the resumption, Shahed ran from the right to whip a nice cross for Rowland and the Nigerian striker cut it back for an unmarked Paulin, who hammered a low drive to find the back of Rahmatganj net in the 77th minute while Rowland doubled and sealed the margin two minutes from time after getting a through-pass from substitute

The Uttara Bank 5th National Archery Championship gets underway from tomorrow at the Army Stadium with 175 archers including 70 women from 51 teams taking part.


