3G auction in Sept to offer five licences

BTRC sets Tk 240cr floor price per Mhz

Mobile operators will get technology neutral spectrum licences for high-speed internet operations through an auction in BTRC Chairman Zia Ahmed. September this year.

The auction will begin with a floor price of Tk 240 crore for per Megahertz airwave in 2,100 band to award five licences, according to draft guidelines prepared by the telecom regulator.

The regulator -- Bangladesh Telecommunication Regulatory Commission (BTRC) -- yesterday sent the guidelines to the telecom ministry which will finally decide on the floor price, design of the

auction and other criteria.

Due to the technology neutral spectrum licences, the operators will be able to go for either 3G or 4G operations, said

Three licences have been suggested for the existing five private operators, while one is for a possible new entrant and the other is for state-run Teletalk, said Ahmed.

However, if the new entrant does not take the licence, an existing local operator will get it, he added.

The BTRC chairman said 50 Megahertz from 2,100 Megahertz band (2110 Mhz to 2160 Mhz) has been selected for auction.

GMG Airlines will refund money to ticketed passengers through the airline's sales offices and give compensation benefits to its employees as it grounds all flights indefinitely from tomorrow, the carrier said in a statement yesterday.

The private airline blamed the suspension of flights on technical problems in aircraft. It said it would take necessary steps to retain its air operator's certificate and frequencies. Sanjiv Kapoor, chief executive officer of GMG, said the

airline would adopt a new strategy, as it planned to exit widebody operations, replacing its Boeing 767s with new generation narrow-bodied aircraft. The airline had a total of eight aircraft of which six were

grounded in 2010 and 2011. At present, the carrier operates flights only on Dhaka-Cox's Bazar and Dhaka-Chittagong-Kolkata routes by two Bombardier Dash 8s, which have recently developed engine problems. People with direct knowledge of the matter said the car-

Beximco to 'acquire' four sister concerns

Bangladesh Export Import Company, popularly known as Beximco, has received regulatory approval to acquire four non-listed subsidiaries of Beximco Group.

The regulator, Securities and Exchange Commission, gave the permission at a meeting with the commission's Chairman Professor M Khairul Hossain in the chair, SEC said in a statement.

Beximco Group's flagship company, Beximco, will acquire all shares of International Knitwear and Apparels Ltd, Beximco Fashions Ltd, Crescent Fashion and Design Ltd and Freshtex Bangladesh (Pvt) Ltd.

Beximco will issue 80.63 lakh ordi-

nary shares of Tk 10 each to acquire the shares of the four companies, the SEC statement said, adding that the newly issued shares will be locked-in for three years.

After issuance of the new shares, paid-up capital of Beximco will reach more than Tk 363 crore from existing Tk 355.50 crore.

Last year Beximco Textiles -known as Bextex -- merged with Beximco at an exchange ratio of one Beximco share for five Bextex shares. Earlier in August of 2006, Beximco Group merged its four textile units into one unit.

Listed on the stockmarket in 1989, Beximco, which has miscellaneous business segments, made a net profit of Tk 685 crore in 2010, according to Dhaka Stock Exchange website.
