

### looking for a break

Shakib Al Hasan is intent on getting a bit of rest from competitive cricket after the upcoming IPL, as he has not taken any substantial time off the game for more than two years. That could mean skipping a stint on the English county circuit this season, following his second season with Kolkata Knight Riders - the IPL ends on May 27, and Shakib is yet to firm up his county plans.

"The county cricket [stint] hasn't been confirmed yet. I still don't know if I would play [county cricket], even if I am fit," Shakib told cricket website Cricinfo. "I haven't stopped [playing] for the last three years, so I am thinking that only if I get a 15 to 20 days rest after the IPL, I will go and play in England. If they [whichever county team he might sign with this season] tell me to go and join them straight after the IPL, I won't go, that's what I have planned."

# Muktijoddha, BU drop points

Both fixtures of the Grameenphone Bangladesh Premier League ended in draws at different venues

yesterday. Newcomers Team BJMC held Muktijoddha Sangsad KC to a goalless draw at the Tangail Stadium while Brothers Union and Farashganj SC played out a goalless draw at the Bangabandhu National Stadium.

The second draw in seven matches left Muktijoddha Sangsad in joint lead along with Abahani on 17 points though Abahani have a match in hand. BJMC are just behind them with 10 points from seven matches.

Brothers moved to the fifth position with nine points from seven outings and Farashganj were in seventh position with seven points from as many matches.

"We could have left the field with full three points had strikers Emily, Sunday, Nasir availed the opportunities that came their way," said Muktijoddha coach Shafiqul Islam Manik after the match.

"Getting one point is a good result as we lost to them twice in the Federation Cup," said Manik. "The unplayable ground condition and sultry atmosphere were also the reasons behind the draw."

"Apart from scoring the goal, we did everything right but luck was not on our side

as Ismail Bangura squandered at least four opportunities," said BJMC coach Jakaria Babu adding that the hot weather affected the players' performance.

At the BNS, it was an equal battle between two mid-table sides as Brothers and Farashganj put up a good show. However, the Brothers officials' verbal abuse against the referee was against the spirit of the game, but surprisingly the referee Mizanur Rahman did not take any measures against officials.

Farashganj dominated the first half and created two scoring chances, one of them was a spot-kick in the 26th minute which Congolese striker Siyo Zunapio blasted against the crosspiece to deprive Farashganj from getting full three points.

Brothers Union, who came into the match on the back of two inspirational victories over Sheikh Russel and Muktijoddha Sangsad, enjoyed lion's share of procession after the break and yielded a number of scoring chances but Farashganj goalkeeper Sultan Ahmed Shakil foiled those attempts. He first thwarted Kinsley Cigozie's shot and later saved Shah Alamgir Anik's attempt before Abdul Malek narrowly missed the target.

With four minutes left, Farashganj almost picked up their second victory when Teajieu Metenow Alban headed a Devis Mario freekick just inches over the crosspiece.

## League in another quandary

The Dhaka Premier Division Cricket League will remain suspended until the authorities reach a decision in a meeting, today, on the latest controversy to hit the domestic game. The appearance of Mohammad Yousuf

for Victoria Sporting Club has been the source of trouble after Abahani contested the Pakistani batsman's "clearance" obtained from Mohammedan Sporting Club, for whom he played last season.

It is the second such delay in two months after the first phase of the competition was suddenly stopped by the Cricket Committee of Dhaka Metropolis on February 1 after 24 chaotic hours previously in which Surjo Tarun gave Kalabagan Krira Chakra an inad-

vertent walkover resulting in their demotion from the top league; BCB director GS Hasan Tamim quit his post as CCDM chairman on the same night. All twelve clubs vehemently protested the stoppage and the league resumed on February 5.

It was expected that after the Bangladesh Premier League T20s and Asia Cup, the Super League phase will see a swift finish, but once again the CCDM not only bowed to pressure, its powerlessness as an independent body has also showed up.

On March 28, Abahani protested Yousuf's participation on the morning of their Super League match against Victoria at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium. When CCDM, the league minders, couldn't provide the relevant paperwork by early afternoon, the Dhanmondi giants directed their playing SEE PAGE 17 COL 6

### Superb Siddikur

Siddikur Rahman birdied the last hole for a five-under-par 67 to pull clear from the chasing pack after the halfway stage of the Panasonic Open India on Friday. Siddikur fired six birdies against one bogey for a six-

under-par 138 total at the 300,000-dollar event sanctioned by the Asian Tour and PGTI.

Thailand's Prom Meesawat was a further shot back with India's Gaganjeet Bhullar, Shankar Das, Ashok Kumar and Manay Jaini at the venerable Delhi Golf Club.

Siddikur, who won his maiden Asian Tour title in 2010, credited his hot putter for the solid round where he made 24 putts highlighted by a monster 30-foot birdie putt on the third hole.

"My putting was so good. My caddy was telling me that I needed to hole the birdie putt on the last hole (12 feet) to lead the tournament and I was very confident because I had a good line," said Siddikur.

Siddikur said his game has been on the upswing since taking a one-week lesson at a golf academy at the renowned TPC Sawgrass in the United States.
