## Minar died of poisoning

Suspect doctors STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Noted journalist Minar Mahmud, editor of nowdefunct weekly Bichinta, died from poisoning, said doctors of Dhaka Medical College (DMC) on completion of his autopsy yesterday.

Dr Sohel Mahmud, a lecturer of forensic medicine department, said they found powder-like substances under Minar's fingernails and yellowish liquid in his stomach while conducting the post-mortem.

"From this, we conclude that he might have died from poisoning," he told The Daily Star.

The journalist was found dead at Dhaka Regency Hotel in the capital on Thursday afternoon. Police recovered empty strips of 150 seda-

#### KIDNEY CANCERS Major rise 'linked to obesity'

Obesity is fuelling a major increase in the number of cases of kidney cancers diagnosed in Britain, experts say.

Cancer Research UK has published figures showing there were just over 9,000 cases in 2009, compared with just under 2,300 in 1975.

Obesity increases kidney cancer risk by about 70 percent, compared with smoking which increases it by about 50 percent.

# Foreign aid to be cut 24pc

The planning ministry has proposed slashing foreign assistance from the current Annual Development Programme by 24 per cent mostly due to non-availability of matching funds and delay in approval from the donors.

According to the proposal, foreign aid of Tk 5,110 crore would be trimmed from the ADP to Tk 16,095 crore, said ministry sources.

Besides, Tk 2,520 crore budget support would be revised to Tk 1,425 crore.

The revised ADP will be placed before a meeting of National Economic Council (NEC) on Sunday for approval.

The ministry has suggested carving the highest Tk 1,254 crore from the Padma Bridge Project.

An Economic Relations Division (ERD) report said finalisation of appointment of contractors for the project will not be possible by June next year as the donors are yet to approve the tender documents.

After reviewing 20 foreign-funded projects, the ERD has listed several reasons for lowering the foreign assistance.

For example, the bank guarantee submitted by the selected bidder of World Bank-funded Efficient Lighting Initiative for Bangladesh (ELIB) project was found fake. As a result the authorities concerned decided to go for re-tendering and a WB assistance of Tk 168 crore remained unutilised.

An ERD high official said in such cases the total tender process needs to start afresh.

#### AL leader shot dead in Cox's Bazar

An Awami League leader was shot dead in Kalarmar Chhara Bazar under Moheshkhali upazila Thursday night.

Police said a gang of around 10 miscreants stormed into the office of Osman Goni, 55, vicepresident of Moheshkhali upazila unit AL. They attacked Osman, also a former UP chairman, stabbing him indiscriminately. The gang fled the scene after shooting him

dead. As the news spread, agitated supporters of Osman Goni set fire to at least 25 houses of local criminal Ziaur Rahman and his gang.



## Old trees felled in **Barisal**

Some 40 old trees on the premises of Barisal General Hospital are being felled to construct a drain and footpath along the boundary wall of the hospital. During a visit to the

hospital early yesterday, this correspondent noticed that workers of a contractor selected by **Barisal City Corporation** (BCC) had felled four mango trees.

Preparations for felling dozens more palm, mango, mahogany and other trees were going on to construct the drain and footpath by a road in front of the hospital.

Contacted, Anisur Rahman, executive engineer of BCC, said "Workers of the contractor cut down the trees without informing the BCC authority."
