'Ensure security of domestic helps'

Speakers at a meeting yesterday emphasised creating awareness among the house owners to ensure security and improve the lives of female domestic helps.

The view exchange meeting on "Safer life for girl domestic workers project" was organised by Young Power in Social Action (YPSA), a non-government organisation (NGO), at its head office at Chandgaon in the port city.

A survey conducted on the female domestic helps of the city's Mehedibag and Bakalia areas found that the workers, mostly hailed from Banskhali and Mirasarai upazilas of Chittagong, came to this profession as a result of poverty, absence of parents or family break-up, said YPSA Project Manager Yasmin Akter.

YPSA set up several training centres to provide education and training among the domestic helps to make them skilled and improve their manners.

Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) Ward Councillor Mohammad Gias Uddin said torture on the domestic helps could be reduced through such awareness.

YPSA Director (Finance) Polash Chowdhury moderated the meeting while its Director Morshed Chowdhury and Associate Programme Officer Nur Mohammad, and Female Ward Councillor Anjuman Ara Begum spoke among others.

Digitisation to end hazards, exploitation: Mosharraf

Labour, Employment and Expatriate Welfare Minister Engineer Khondoker Mosharraf Hossain yesterday said the full implementation of the present government's digitisation process would bring an end to the hazards and exploitation by the various intermediary groups in taking services from different government and non-government agencies.

Inaugurating a four-day Digital Innovation Fair-2012, organised by Faridpur district administration at Ambica hall in Faridpur, the minister said the digitisation process had already brought relief from sufferings for the rural people.

PS-1 to prime minister and National Project Director of Support to Digital Bangladesh Md Nazrul Islam Khan said 20,000 offices of districts, upazila and unions would go for automation by June this year, aimed at ensuring all public services at the doorstep of the people.

Other speakers said that e-service centres had already been providing hassle free online services to the people, replacing the traditional cumbersome system. Digitisation had saved time, money and labour of the rural people, who earlier faced troubles in getting services in the old manual system, they added.

BSS City Editor and Focal Point of BSS -A2I Media Campaign Ajit Kumar Sarkar said education, knowledge, information and communication were the core of human progress.

"The digitisation process has made it possible to build a knowledge-based society and ensure empowerment of people", he added.

The inaugural session was presided over by Deputy Commissioner of Faridpur Helaluddin Ahmed.

It was also addressed by Additional Deputy Commissioner and Focal Point of Faridpur district e-service Md Jahangir Hossain, Bangladesh Computer Council Executive Director Dr Gayanandra Nath Biswas and Bangladesh Computer Samity President Faezulla Khan.

cumbed to his injuries two hours after admission. Our Benapole Correspondent adds: A man was killed on the spot as a truck hit his battery-run three-wheeler (locally


