Mayor hopefuls warned by EC

Chief Election Commissioner Kazi Rakibuddin Ahmad yesterday urged DCC mayoral and councillor hopefuls to immediately remove their posters, billboards and banners from the city streets.

"If they fail to do so before the announcement of the election schedule, they will be held responsible for flouting the electoral code of conduct," warned the CEC.

He was talking to reporters after a meeting with senior officials of law enforcement agencies to review the situation in

the capital ahead of the polls to Dhaka city corporations -- north and south.

He expressed satisfaction with the present law and order. "We were apprised of the prevailing situation. We will sit again to discuss maintain law and order during the polls."

The EC may announce the schedule by the middle of this month. The polls will be held at the end of next month.

Rakibuddin said after the announce ment of the election schedule the EC might allow the aspirants a maximum of 24 hours to remove all the campaign signs **SEE PAGE 19 COL 2**

Two Indian army units that moved towards New Delhi on a January night without notifying the government raised alarm in the capital, the Indian Express newspaper reported yesterday, but the Defense Ministry and army quickly denied the report.

The infantry unit of the 33rd Armored Division based 150 km from Delhi and a unit of the airborne 50 Para brigade based in Agra to the south reached the outskirts of Delhi before being ordered back, the newspaper said.


