# Traffic thrown into a tailspin

*Karail slum dwellers block roads in Dhaka over eviction, DU students over attack on minorities in Satkhira*

Thousands of people suffered in huge tailbacks as Karail slum dwellers and Dhaka university students blocked roads in the capital's Mohakhali and Shahbagh areas from morning till afternoon yesterday.

Airport Road traffic came to a halt around 9:00am, the peak business hour, as over a thousand people put up barricades at Chairmanbari,

Amtoli intersection and Mohakhali Wireless Gate, protesting their eviction from Karail slum on Wednesday. DU Jagannath Hall students demonstrated in Shahbagh area, obstructing vehicular movement from around 11:00am.

They demanded justice for assaults on minorities by a group of religious bigots irate over a drama at Fatehpur High School in Kaliganj

# Air Force investigator found dead in hotel

A squadron leader of Bangladesh Air Force, who was investigating alleged looting of a Chittagong shrine by Rab personnel, was found dead in a hotel room in the port city yesterday.

Police recovered the body of Squadron Leader Mamun Ur Rashid, 45, from a room of Silver Inn on Station Road around 2:00pm.

Mamun, son of Mujibur Rahman of Rangpur, was stationed in Kurmitola Air Force base in Dhaka. He went to Chittagong on Tuesday to conduct a departmental probe into the activities of Flight Lieutenant Mahmudul Hasan, who was among 10 Rapid Action Battalion personnel accused of looting the money of a shrine in Talshara of Anwara upazila in November last year, said Rab-7

# Big buys done with cooperative money

Destiny Group has been selling shares of its sister concerns to its cooperative arm, putting several lakh members' money at risk as some of these concerns exist on paper only.

In the last 10 months alone, Destiny Multipurpose Cooperative Society

Limited (DMCSL), Destiny's cooperative wing, bought all or most of the shares of 29 companies at over Tk356.64 crore.

Of the total purchase, more than Tk 80 crore was spent to buy some 15 of its sister concerns, including Destiny-2000 Ltd at more than Tk 16.78 crore, according to a document of the Department of

# Recruiting system to be blamed

*Escap report calls for effective policy*

The overseas recruitment system in Bangladesh pushes low-skilled migrants into debt because of the high expenditure they have borne even before their departure, said the UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP).

Responsible are the middlemen who charge exorbitantly for some illegal facili-

ties they provide job seekers or recruiting agencies with. They often "buy" job offers from foreign employers and sell those to aspirant migrants or authorised recruiting agencies, said Anisur Rahman Khan, executive director of migrants rights body International Migrants Alliance Research Foundation, explaining why the migration cost is so high.

There are also those who fleece aspirants

# Why Rab actions result in deaths?

*Rights chief sees flaw in its training*

Training of Rapid Action Battalion personnel is faulty since when they go to catch someone, it ends in deaths, said National Human Rights Commission Chairman Mizanur Rahman yesterday.

"Why does it end with death when you go out to nab someone? Why would your training be like



this? If you need to shoot why do your bullets hit a part that causes death?" he told reporters after the concluding session of a workshop.

"Certainly there is inadequacy somewhere in their [Rab's] training and that needs to be looked into," Mizanur said, while speaking on the recent
