US wants to work with Bangladesh on security

Will hold dialogue here on April 19, says Sherman

UNB, Dhaka

The United States will hold a security dialogue with Bangladesh here on April 19 on security challenges that the two countries face here, in this region and throughout the world.

"It's a transparent dialogue. We want to work together on all of the security challenges that we face here, through this region and the world," US Under-Secretary for Political Affairs Wendy Sherman told reporters yesterday after nearly an hour-long meeting with Foreign Minister Dipu Moni.

Sherman said the US assistant secretary for political and military affairs will be here on April 19 for a security dialogue as they want strong security discussions with Bangladesh.

Asked if US wants to deploy more US military in Bangladesh for regional security, the US under-secretary said they have "no plan now to do so."

She said US has been assisting Bangladesh in whatever way they can in the disaster preparedness and they would continue to do so.

Sherman, the third-ranking official of the US State Department, said Bangladesh has to be congratulated for its zero tolerance to terrorism and its work against violent extremism. It is a very tough job and Bangladesh will have to work hard to be successful in this arena.

Replying to a question about the standoff

between the two major parties here on the modality of holding the next general elections, she said the political leadership will have to find a room, sit down and talk different models and process to ensure free, fair, credible and participatory elections.

Sherman said the leaders of all parties, not only major parties, will have to come together and respond to the aspiration of the people.

Earlier, in a brief statement, Sherman said US wants to be a strong partner of democracy, sustained market economy, and wants free, fair and participatory elections in 2013-14. She said the United States will provide one billion US dollars over the next five years for

assisting Bangladesh in health, food security, disaster management and climate change. Like every other country, Bangladesh has also many challenges to confront in the future, she added. Sherman, who came here on Thursday on a two-day visit, went a Grameen village in Manikganj to see how people, largely women,

are trying to lift them out of poverty. She said Bangladesh is a model for others to fight against poverty. US Ambassador to Bangladesh Dan

Mozena was, among others, present on the occasion.

Terming her visit to Bangladesh spectacular, Sherman said that during her brief visit, she held discussions with ministers and members of the civil society and had excellent talks with the prime minister, the foreign minister and the leader of the opposition.

Good governance for energy security stressed

Speakers at a seminar yesterday emphasised the necessity of good governance to ensure the country's energy security.

They urged the governing bodies to avoid unsolicited deals for transparency and accountability in this sector. "Abundant reserve of energy resources may not be able to

ensure energy security and sustainable economic growth in the absence of good governance," said Prof Nurul Islam of Institute of Appropriate Technology under Buet.

Department of Chemical Engineering and Chemical Engineering Alumni Association of Buet organised the national seminar styled "Energy Resources and Governance Issue-Bangladesh Perspective" at Buet auditorium.

Nurul Islam, who presented the keynote speech, said a large number of organisations are in control of the sector and they need to work together to ensure a good governing body. He stressed on institutional reformation, enactment of new policies, resource assessment and capacity development

for proper management of the sector. All procurements of energy sector should be made as per the Public Procurement Act 2006 and the Public Procurement Rules 2008 and unsolicited deals should be avoided for trans-

parency and accountability, he said. Considering future of energy demand, the government should enact a law for no export of energy in the next 50 years, said Nurul Islam adding enactment of energy conservation law is needed to ensure effective use of energy.

Maj Gen (retd) Shubid Ali Bhuiyan, chairman of parliamentary standing committee on ministry of power, energy and mineral resources, said all decisions should be taken as per the laws to ensure transparency and accountability of the sector.

He said a coordinated plan is required for sustainable energy security.

Prof SM Nazrul Islam, vice-chancellor of Buet, Prof Habibur Rahman, pro-vice chancellor of Buet, and Badrul Imam, Geology professor of Dhaka University, spoke among others.

Guard stabbed to death in capital

Unidentified miscreants stabbed to death a security guard of under-construction Kuril flyover in the capital early yesterday. Ruhul Amin, 25, was found lying with grievous injury on his throat at the project site around midnight, said Golam Mostafa, another guard, who rushed him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

"Ruhul was on his duty near the rail tracks adjacent to the project's cordoned area. Rest of us were deployed at different points. Suddenly, we heard someone screaming near the rail tracks around 12:15am," said Mostafa.

Colleagues of the victim rushed to the spot and found Ruhul injured. He was declared dead at DMCH around

Hasan said perhaps construction material thieves entered into the cordoned area and Ruhul might be killed for resisting them.

Police is investigating the matter, he added.
