

It took the Bangladesh Cricket Board ten days to restart the Dhaka Premier Cricket League on April 10 after its directors reached a decision in an emergency meeting last night.

Apart from the date, the BCB have come to the conclusion that Mohammad Yousuf will not be allowed to further participate in the tournament while the quote for foreign registration will be increased from eight to ten, though only three would be allowed to play in a Premier League game.

BJMC demolish Arambagh

Team BJMC recorded the biggest victory of the season as they

thrashed Arambagh KC 5-0 in their Grameenphone Bangladesh Premier League encounter at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

The huge win lifted the newcomers to solo third position with 13 points from eight matches while Arambagh continue to struggle at ninth position with eight points from the same number of matches.

Guinean forward Ismael Bangoura scored a brace while Abdullah Parvez, Mohammad Biplob and Uche Felix scored the other three. However, Nigerian forward Ajagoun Abdur Rasheed was the chief architect of the big win as he created three of the chances that were scored of.

The visitors BJMC took the lead in the 14th minute, thanks to a fumble from the Arambagh goalkeeper Mostafizur Rahman who failed to grip Abdul Rasheed's shot. The ball fell to an unmarked Mohammad Biplob in front of goal and the striker neatly placed the ball at the back of the net.

The margin was doubled four minutes

later when midfielder Abdullah Parvez beat the keeper at the far post with a curling shot from the top of the box. BJMC onslaught continued as it took them only two more minutes to find the third. Ismael Bangoura, the Guinean forward, played a neat one-two with Rasheed before the Guinean striker finished with a placing shot at the near post.

There were no more goals in the first half, but Bangoura scored again on the hour mark. This time too he combined superbly with his striking partner as Rasheed played a through pass from the left flank and Bangoura tapped the ball in from close range. Nigerian midfielder Uche Felix put the icing on the cake with a fifth goal in the 79th minute as his fierce 25-yard shot was too good for the keeper to deal with.

BJMC coach Jakaria Babu was ecstatic about the victory as he said they are still in the title race. "We could have won by a bigger margin as the players were confident and we dominated the match. Even though we are at number three, there is still a long way to go for the league where we can take ourselves even higher," said Babu after the match.

BFF polls now on April 30

The scheduled election and general meeting of the Bangladesh Football Federation has been deferred by two days, decided an emergency meeting of the executive committee of BFF yesterday. The polls will now be held on April 30 instead of April 28 after the some councillors of affiliated educational institutions appealed for a twoday deferment, informed BFF's senior vice-president Abdus Salam Murshedy after the meeting at the BFF House yesterday. In line with the decision, the last date of sending names of delegates for the election has also been deferred to April 9.

The BFF polls will be contested for 21 postspresident, five vicepresidents and 15 members, to be elected by 129 of its members who represent district sports associations, clubs, and other BFFaffiliated institutions.

England stay on top

Swann scripts series-levelling win

Graeme Swann claimed a match haul of 10 wickets as England roared to a serieslevelling win over Sri Lanka in the second and final Test on Saturday to retain their number one ranking.

Swann followed his four wickets in the first innings with six in the second as Sri Lanka were bowled out for 278 at the stroke of lunch on the fifth day at the P Sara Oval in Colombo.

England, set a modest against Sri Lanka in Galle. target of 94, coasted home by eight wickets despite a brief stutter at 31-2 following the dismissals of skipper Andrew Strauss for no score

and Jonathan Trott for five. Alastair Cook and Kevin Pietersen carried the tourists home with a brisk thirdwicket stand of 66 in 69 balls, amid wild celebrations from some 5,000 travelling English fans at the ground. Left-hander Cook

remained unbeaten on 49 and Pietersen, who hit a century in the first innings, smashed 42 not out from 28 balls, signalling his team's emphatic victory with a six off Tillakaratne Dilshan.

It was England's first win in five Tests on their Asian sojourn this year after being thrashed 3-0 by Pakistan in the United Arab Emirates and losing the first Test

The ICC confirmed that England and South Africa were level at the top of the Test charts with 116 rating points, but Strauss's men nudged ahead when the

ratings were calculated beyond the decimal point. Sri Lanka, currently

ranked sixth, paid the price for not reaching 300 in either innings of the match and will remain without a series win since 2009, when they beat
