India's World Cup cricket hero Yuvraj Singh returned home on Monday after receiving treatment for a cancerous tumour in the United States.

Sporting a black jacket and red baseball cap, the 30year-old all-rounder gave thumbs up signs to wellwishers who had gathered at New Delhi airport to welcome him back.

"He is absolutely fine and will rest at home for another 10-15 days," his mother Shabnam Singh told reporters at the airport.

Left-handed Yuvraj, named man-of-thetournament after India's World Cup triumph at home last April, was diagnosed with a rare condition, mediastinal seminoma -- a malignant tumour between his lungs -soon after the event.

After completing three sessions of chemotherapy in Boston in March, he had moved to London before returning to India. "Finally the day has

come! i am going home tomorrow! cant wait, excited to see my friends and family .see you india!!," Yuvraj said on Twitter on Sunday.

Thousands of wellwishers, politicians, his teammates and other sports personalities including US cycling great Lance Armstrong had sent messages to the ailing allrounder who is known for his aggressive batting and disciplined spin bowling.

"Today the entire country is happy, god is happy and I am very happy. My son has come back as a winner," Yuvraj's father Yograj Singh told the NDTV news channel.

One match ban on Sohel

Bangladesh Football Federation's disciplinary committee has imposed a one-match suspension on Abahani goalkeeper Shahidul Alam Sohel for his unsporting behaviour. The young goalkeeper, who is also the first choice keeper of the national team, got into an altercation with the referee Jalal Uddin and shoved him a couple of times during Abahani's Premier League match against Farashganj SC on April 4. The keeper also refused to shake hands with the referee and opposition players after the match. The referee has also been served a show cause notice by the referees' committee for the same incident.

Abahani were also fined Tk 25,000 for not being able to control its supporters from attacking the match officials while the club masseur has been banned from the stadium for the season for throwing a water bottle at the referee.

The disciplinary committee also served a caution notice to Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club and Muktijodhha Sangsad for other incidents.

Sachin Tendulkar's return to the Mumbai Indians squad for Monday's match against Deccan Chargers looks uncertain, after he said on Twitter that the finger injury he sustained in the opening game against Chennai Super Kings did "not look good".

Tendulkar posted a photograph of the injured finger on his right hand and tweeted around noon on Monday.

Tendulkar had to retire hurt on 16 after being struck on the glove by Doug Bollinger in the ninth over of the IPL's opening game between Mumbai Indians and Super Kings. He then missed Mumbai Indians' first home game, against Pune Warriors, and if he does not play today his next game could be against Rajasthan Royals on April 11.

Just before the start of IPL 2012, Tendulkar had handed over the leadership of the Mumbai Indians to Harbhajan Singh, because he wanted to take a "break from the responsibility of captaincy". Harbhajan had led Mumbai Indians to the Champions League T20 title last year and was an automatic choice to take over the captaincy.

a match-winning unbeaten 73. Daniel Christian, not the wisest choice for the final over, dished out two full tosses to Rohit Sharma, including the final ball which was smacked over long-on with three needed.

Kumar Sangakkara had bowled out his best bowler, Dale Steyn, leaving the final honours to Christian. The first ball was smashed by James Franklin wide of long-off for four. With five needed off two, the penultimate ball was forced to long-off and Rohit Sharma timed his dive just in time to survive a run-out appeal. Christian couldn't come up with anything special, gifting Rohit Sharma with the most hittable delivery of the over, breaking many hearts of the home 41, D Christian 39, C White 30 not out; M fans who went home disappointed for the Patel 4-20, S Malinga 3/27, K Pollard 2-33) second time in as many games.

Fortunes kept oscillating in the final overs, but for most periods in the chase, the Chargers were in control. Much of the credit

Serena's first in 2012

Fifth seeded Serena Williams captured her 40th career WTA title by overpowering ninth seeded Czech Lucie Safarova 6-0, 6-1 at the Charleston clay court tournament on Sunday.

The 13-time Grand Slam winner needed just 58 minutes to dispatch Safarova in her first final appearance since last year's US Open when she lost to Samantha

"I definitely want to con-

tinue this," said Williams who will move from 10 to nine when the new world rankings come out. "I've never played consistently at such a high level

with low errors like this, and

the scary thing is I could

have served so much better." This marked Williams' first WTA title since turning 30 in September and she is the first 30-year-old to win on the green clay in Charleston since Martina

Navratilova in 1990.
