### to get stimulus Govt moves to raise Aus rice

production

The government will provide a Tk 35 crore stimulus package for 3.55 lakh marginal farmers to boost rice production in the upcoming Aus season.

Under the package, farmers will get for free 8kg of Narica or 5kg of high-yielding paddy seeds, 16kg of urea and 10kg of DAP and MOP fertilisers per bigha of land, Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury said at a press conference yesterday at her secretariat office.

She said Narica paddy seeds will be distributed mostly among the farmers of the uplands as it is drought tolerant and could be harvested within 90-100 days.

Last year the government provided Tk 34.93 crore worth of stimulus package for the farmers for cultivating This year around 48,966 hectares of land in 56 districts


