Abidal goes under knife

Barcelona's French defender Eric Abidal was recovering in intensive care on Wednesday, after undergoing a lengthy liver transplant operation, the Catalan daily Mundo Deportivo said.

The newspaper said in its online edition that the surgery started at about 3:00 pm local time (1300 GMT) on Tuesday and finished at midnight (2200 GMT). The 32-year-old player was then taken to a specialist unit for post-operative care, it added.

Barcelona announced on March 15 that Abidal needed a liver transplant "in the coming weeks", nearly a year after he had a tumour removed from the same organ.

Club officials have expressed hopes that he will return to action but Spanish transplant experts have voiced doubts that he can play top-flight football again, given the risk of complications if he picked up a knock in his abdomen.

Portugal jumped two places to fifth, leapfrogging 2014 World Cup hosts Brazil who dropped one place, while Denmark's ninth place is their highest position since August 1997.

Italy (12th) and Argentina (10th) dropped three and two places respectively.



Defending champions Barcelona upped the pressure on leaders Real Madrid on Tuesday as they moved to within a point of their bitter rivals after a 4-0 thumping of Getafe.

Two goals from Alexis Sanchez, one from Pedro

Rodriguez and Lionel Messi's 39th in the league this season gave Barca a 10th consecutive league victory after another near perfect performance by the Catalans.

In the 22nd minute the home crowd chanted the name of Eric Abidal, the French international who on Tuesday underwent a liver transplant, in recognition of the number 22 shirt he wears as part of Barca's squad.

The clash between Barca and Madrid on April 21st in the Camp Nou has become increasingly important as the Catalans have reduced the gap on Madrid from 10 points to only one in less than a month.

Barcelona dominated Getafe throughout, controlling possession with their usual passing game and goal-

keeperVictorValdes summed up the situation on the final whistle.

"Our work is done here, lets wait and see what Madrid do tomorrow night in their game," he said. However coach Pep Guardiola was cau-

tious about talking about his team's title chances. "All we can do is think about our games, we have a big game away to Levante at the

weekend and then a Champions League semi-final, we have to focus on those games and nobody elses," he said. Andres Iniesta had the game's first draw to help both teams edge closer to chance when his shot was tipped over by

Miguel Angel Moya in the Getafe goal on 12 minutes. A minute later and Barca were ahead.

Iniesta started the move on the left for Messi to chest the ball into the path of the Chilean Sanchez who made no mistake from 20 yards out.

On 17 minutes the lead was almost doubled when Xavi Hernandez had appeared to finish perfectly a neat passing move only for Argentinian centre-half Cata Diaz to scoop the ball clear on the goal-line.

Barca continued to dominate but did not add to their lead until just before half-time when Iniesta supplied Messi with a delightful back flick for the Argentinian to finish with a powerful shot.

On 72 minutes Alexis doubled his tally heading home an inch perfect right-wing cross from youngster Isaac Cuenca.

Two minutes later and it was another header from Pedro who rounded off the scoring when he was quickest to meet a right-wing free-kick from Messi.

Barca turned on the style for the final minutes and Messi almost scored again from an impossible angle with two minutes

remaining after a twisting run had taken him past 3

defenders. Earlier on Tuesday Raul Garcia scored two secondhalf goals to help Osasuna beat Espanyol 2-0 in a battle between two teams compet-

ing for places in next season's

Europa League. For Osasuna the result was the perfect recovery from last weekend's 6-0 reversal at Rayo Vallecano, however they were helped by a card happy referee who booked players from start to finish.

Espanyol ended the game with nine men when Philippe Courtois and Juan Forlin were sent off in the second half for two bookable offences each.

Osasuna stay sixth on 46 points while Espanyol, who have not won in five matches, remain four points behind in ninth position. Real Betis and Real Sociedad shared a 1-1

survival. Carlos Vela put Sociedad ahead just after half-time before Ruben Castro equalised on

69 minutes for Betis. Earlier Imanol Agirretxe had a first-half penalty saved by Fabricio Agosto in the Betis goal.

Mario escapes further ban

Manchester City striker Mario Balotelli will not face further punishment following his wild tackle on Arsenal midfielder Alex Song last weekend, the Football Association confirmed on Tuesday.

Balotelli, who was given a three-match ban following his sending off for a lunge on Bacary Sagna later in the same game, had faced the prospect of additional punishment for a dangerous, studs-up, shinhigh challenge on Song.

But because referee Martin Atkinson saw the incident -- while missing the extent of the challenge - and chose not to take any action at the time, the FA said they were unable to act retrospectively.

"Retrospective action in relation to the incident involving Mario Balotelli of Manchester City and Alex Song of Arsenal, which occurred in the 20th minute of Sunday's game, will not be taken," the FA said.

"Where at least one of the officials has seen the coming together of players retrospective action is not taken, regardless of whether they have seen the full extent of the challenge.

"Retrospective action can only be taken in scenarios where none of the match officials saw the players coming together. The normal scenarios in which retrospective action is taken are for 'off the ball' incidents."

Milan back on top

AC Milan went back to the top of Serie A, for 24 hours at least, with a hard fought 1-0 victory at Chievo in rainy Verona on Tuesday.

Milan bounced straight back from Saturday's 2-1 defeat at home to Fiorentina despite being ravaged by injury and suspensions -- they had 14 players missing.

Ghana midfielder Sulley Muntari scored the only goal of the game early on as Milan moved two points clear of Juventus.

The Old Lady of Turin can retake the lead if they beat Lazio on Wednesday.

It was a far from vintage Milan performance as Chievo bossed the game but showing the true form of champions they managed to nick the three points despite not playing well.

Such were their problems that coach Massimiliano Allegri gave teenage full-back Mattia De Sciglio a first ever league start, although he previously played in the Champions League. And veteran midfielder Gennaroi Gattuso

was draughted back in for a first start since September. Under pressure after picking up a single

point from their previous two games and being overhauled by Juve, Milan needed a bt of luck and things immediately started to look rosy.

Muntari set his sights from more than 25 yards out and although he hit his strike truly, goalkeeper Stefano Sorrentino seemed slow in diving to his right and the ball nestled into
