The deceased was identified as Md Bakir, son of rickshaw puller Dulu Mia.



The victim's body bears signs of beatings, said Jahangir.

Man shot dead 2 bodies recovered in Ctg

A man was shot dead and two people, including a woman, were found dead in Chittagong yesterday.

Our Ctg correspondent reports: A gang of armed robbers, during a robbery, shot Abdul Monaf, 48, at Banpukur Bazar of Chunati in Lohagara upazila.

Lohagara police said the gang broke open the doors of the shops at the Bazar at around 1:30am and shot Monaf, leaving him dead when he reached the spot hearing noise. In another incident, police recovered the body, wearing

trouser and T-shirt, of an unidentified youth, aged around 30, from a water reservoir of an under-construction building at Agrabad in the port city yesterday. Double-Mooring police said a gang of miscreants might kill

him four or five days ago and they left him in the reservoir.

Yet another incident, police recovered the body of Phul Banu, 50, wife of Abu Khan, of Barisal, from Achargona in Bhujpur at around 1:00am.

Bhujpur police said she had been missing since April 5 after coming to Chittagong.

Feni Mayor Nizam Uddin Hazari and senior railway officials of Chittagong zone accompanied Quader, who took the additional charge of the railway ministry on Wednesday after Suranjit Sengupta resigned amid criticism over aTk70lakh cash haul scandal.

Quader expressed his frustration stepping into several offices at the station and seeing the

surrounding environment. The phone wire at the assistant station master's room was found disconnected. He was also not given any answer to who

was given lease of the huge railway pond.

Within Monday, the minister asked officials to provide list of the railway's property and who were residing at the quarters. Passengers at the station complained to the minister that there had been no improvement in the intercity trains' schedule. Even in his presence, Chittagong-bound Mohanagar

Godhuly reached the station an hour beyond schedule. Quader told journalists the station officials had received information of his arrival beforehand and tried to showcase the station to be neat and clean. "But they are fresh only in their outlook, while their inside is dark [dirty]. This

Says Quamrul

State Minister for Law Quamrul Islam yesterday said nobody will be able to protect the war criminals despite the opposition BNP's "deep plot" against the government.

"BNP organising secretary (Sylhet division) M Ilias Ali's disappearance is part of their conspiracy... the opposition party is involved in the conspiracy to oust the elected government and bring another 1/11 in the country," he said at a discussion at the Jatiya Press Club in the capital.

Biswa Kabitakantha Parishad organised the discussion to press for accelerating the ongoing trial of war criminals.

Chaired by Parishad president Jahangir Alam, the meeting was addressed, among others, by Awami League leaders Satish Chandra Roy and Shah Alam Murad, poet Kazi Rosy, organising secretary of Krishak League MA Karim and Jatiya Ganotantrik League president MA Aziz.

According to locals, the poverty stricken people of the village collects water for their daily needs from a single tube-well installed by local government. However, yesterday after-


noon villagers were arguing over collecting water from the tube-well. Soon it evolved into a clash with bamboo and other wooden sticks, they said.
