39 NGOs announce info disclosure policy

Thirty nine non-government organisations (NGO) yesterday announced to have voluntarily formulated their respective information disclosure policy in line with the Right to Information (RTI) Act to make more information available to the public.

Of these NGOs, which monitor service delivery of the government agencies at local level across the country, 30 have already given approval to their policies. The announcement came at a

workshop in the capital's Brac Centre Inn, moderated by Farid Hossain, bureau chief of Associated Press. Management and Resources

Development Initiative (MRDI), supported by USAID Bangladesh's Promoting Governance, Accountability, Transparency and Integrity (Progati) Program, was the organiser. Thanking the Information

Commission, MRDI, Transparency International Bangladesh and other organisations, USAID Progati Chief of Party Dennis Gallagher said, "If it (the act) can not get outside of Dhaka, it is not going to be very effective."

He said the focus on proactive disclosure is really important for both the government and nongovernmental agencies because it creates openness. "In the long term what this is all about is it is trying to

Directorate of Environment (DoE) has summoned the managing director of Premier Cement Ltd on charges of grabbing a portion of the Shitalakkhya River in the bordering area between Narayanganj and Munshiganj.

A press release signed by Assistant Director (Enforcement) of the DoE Abdulllah Al Mamun said yesterday.

In a notice issued by the DoE, the managing director has been directed to appear before the DoE head office on April 23 and to explain why a case would not be filed against the company, the grabbed part of

the river would not be recovered, compensation would not be realised for causing damage to the environment and the goods of the company, kept on the grabbed part, would not be seized.

The DoE notice said the company had grabbed the river beyond the border pillars of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA).

It said damaging environment and ecology by filling any water body is a cognisable offence as per Bangladesh Environment Protection Act, 1995 (Amended 2010).

Copies of the notice have been sent to the chairman of BIWTA and the deputy commissioners of Narayanganj and Munshiganj.
