China's Hu urges N Korea to seek peace

Chinese President Hu Jintao yesterday told a visiting North Korean official that the two countries should work towards "peace and stability" after a missile launch by Pyongyang, state media said.


Speaking in a meeting with Kim Yong-Il, a top official of North Korea's ruling Korean

Workers' Party, Hu called for greater cooperation with its traditional ally, the state-run Xinhua news agency reported.

China is the sole major ally and a source of economic support for the isolated state.

"We will... strengthen strategic links and coordination on major international and regional issues for the purpose of safeguarding lasting peace and stability of the Korean

peninsula," Hu was quoted as saying. His remarks follow the April 13 launch of what Pyongyang says was a communications satellite, but which the United States has called a disguised ballistic missile test. It



The United States and other critics have said the launch violated United Nations restrictions imposed on North Korea. The UN Security Council strongly condemned it and said it would tighten existing sanc-

The Xinhua report made no specific mention of the missile launch. However, China has previously voiced misgivings over its neighbour's defiant act.

Speaking before the launch, Hu expressed "serious concern" about the plan during a meeting last month with US President Barack Obama.

In yesterday's meeting, Hu praised North Korea's new leader Kim Jong-Un, saying he would lead the country to new achievements.

Kim Jong-Un took the reins of the poor and isolated state after the death in December of his father, longtime supreme leader Kim Jong-Il.

Romney campaigns with Crime generates potential VP pick Rubio

Presumptive Republican nominee Mitt Romney was campaigning in Pennsylvania ahead of the state's Tuesday primary with Marco Rubio in tow, the US senator widely discussed as a possible running mate.

Rubio is the latest among

potential vice presidential picks to hit the campaign trail with Romney, but the first since the frontrunner's main rival Rick Santorum bowed out of the Republican race two weeks ago.

President Barack Obama ahead of the November election, and he told a crowd in Greencastle that Americans needed to help him battle against the cancer that is big government.

"This president has a road that he's traveling down where government gets larger and larger and metastasizes into every aspect of American life," Romney said late Sunday.

Obama, he said, subscribes to "a view that somehow government knows better than free people. I disagree entirely."

Romney became the allbut-certain Republican flagbearer when Santorum, a former senator from Pennsylvania, called it quits earlier this month.

And while the frontrunner was focused on a Romney-Obama showdown, he was making a final sweep through the Keystone State as he seeks to secure the delegates needed to be declared the nominee.

Four other states also vote on today: Romney has already pivoted toward Connecticut, Delaware, New York and Rhode

Romney was to attend an event in South Park Township outside Pittsburgh early yesterday with former Homeland Security secretary Tom Ridge.

Rubio then joins Romney at a town hall event in Aston at 12:55 pm (1655 GMT) for what could be seen as a test run for a possible Romney-Rubio ticket.

trillions of dollars

Says a UN official

Criminality worldwide generates proceeds in the trillions of dollars each year, making crime one of the world's "top 20 economies," a senior UN official said yesterday

With the scope of global crime - and particularly organised crime - threatening emerging economies and fomenting international instability, Yury Fedotov called for concerted world action to combat the trend.

"We need to recognize that the problem requires a global solution," Fedotov, the head of the UN Office on Drugs and Crime, told reporters outside an international conference focused on preventing the exploitation of illegal migrants and other crimes linked to human trafficking. "No country can handle this problem alone.'

Fedotov said that "criminal business" earns those behind it \$2.1 trillion - nearly 1.6 trillion euros - a year, which he said is equivalent to nearly 7 percent of the size of the global economy.

In separate comments inside the meeting, he said that as many as 2.4 million people may be victims of human trafficking worldwide at any given time, calling it "a shameful crime of modern-day slavery."

Corruption is another concern of the meeting. Fedotov told the opening session that estimates put the amount of money lost through corruption in developing countries at \$40 billion annually.

Breivik offers apology to his non-political victims

Anders Behring Breivik, who killed 77 people last July, said yesterday he wanted to apologise for killing "innocent" people in his Oslo bombing, but offered no similar apology for the Utoeya massacre.

He also insisted that not only his victims and their families had their lives ruined

on July 22: "I also lost everything," he lamented to the court, maintaining he was the victim of "clear racism." For the first time since his trial started on

April 16, the 33-year-old right-wing extremist voiced a small ounce of regret for his

"I would like to offer a large apology" to those who were injured or killed in the bombing of an Oslo government building as they were just passing by and had no political connections, he said.

But when prosecutor Inga Bejer Engh asked if he wanted to say the same to any of

the 69 people -- mainly teens -slaughtered in his shooting massacre on the nearby island of Utoeya after the bombing, Breivik said: "No, I do not." He reiterated that young-

Tito, former joint secretary of Khulna MMCT College unit of JCD, pro-BNP student organisation, and Munna were hung from the ceiling and blindfolded while being beaten, the report said.

Police picked up the two during a clash between prohartal pickets and law enforcers at Tutpara Central Road intersection in the city around 10:00am Sunday,

said eyewitnesses. Informed by relatives of the duo, a horde of journalists rushed to the police station and took photographs of the two being tortured.

Fearful of media coverage, the OC had ordered his junior officers to persuade the journalists not to publish any stories on the matter but to no avail.

Kamruzzaman, however, denies the allegation and claims that Munna and Tito were involved in a petrol bomb attack on a police team during hartal hours on Sunday. None of the cops, however, was injured.

Talking to The Daily Star, he also added, "We hung and blindfolded the two only to scare them into giving us the names of the people who were involved in the clash."

The metropolitan magistrate's court in Khulna yesterday afternoon sent Tito and Munna to jail and permitted police to interrogate

them for only one day.

The injured activists told The Daily Star that they were not involved in hurling bomb at the police on Sunday.

Meanwhile, Khulna City BNP President Nazrul Islam Manju, also a lawmaker, yesterday demanded immediate removal of OC Kamruzzaman from police service.

At a press briefing, he also demanded unconditional withdrawal of all "false" cases against detained leaders and workers of Khulna BNP.
