# Farmers eye bumper Irri-boro Student commits' suicide'

Farmers and agriculture officials are expecting bumper production of Irriboro paddy in 10 southwestern districts under Khulna division in the current season.

The Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE) has set production target of 34,34,506.5 tonnes of boro paddy in 10 districts under Khulna division this season, reports our correspondent from Kushtia.

This is 1,04,476.5 tonnes higher than last year's, said DAE officials, adding that this time farmers have cultivated boro on 6,07,470 hectares of land in the 10 districts while it was 5,84,497 hectares last year.

Of the 10 districts --Kushtia, Meherpur, Chuadanga, Jhenidah, Magura, Jessore, Narail, Bagerhat, Satkhira and Khulna, Jessore sees the highest target of 1,56,920 hectares of land for boro cultivation.

Target areas in other districts are 86,325 hectares in Jhenidah, 44,480 hectares in Magura, 44,390 hectares in Narail, 50,025 hectares in Khulna, 47,385 hectares in Bagerhat, 73,985 hectares in Satkhira, 37,460 hectares in Kushtia and 40,550 hectares in Chuadanga, and the lowest 25,950 hectares in Meherpur.

Hybrid boro will be cultivated on 1,86,385 hectares, high yielding varieties on 4,15,630 hectares and local varieties on saplings for high prices. 5,455 hectares of land.

"Farmers are getting all kinds of support including ply water in the paddy

subsidised fertilisers and necessary electricity," Abdul Mannan, additional director of DAE, Khulna division in Jessore, told this correspondent over phone.

As this correspondent contacted DAE officials in other districts over phone, they shared similar views, saying that they got reports of good cultivation mainly because of favourable weather, proper irrigation facilities and supply of fertiliser.

The farmers have planted different types of paddy like Brri-28, 45, 33, 50, 26, 39, Hira, super hybrid, Madhumati, Aftab, Aloran, Tyia, Ratna, Kajal Lata IR-50, GS, Kargil, agriculture officials said.

This time 7 to 12 percent extra yields is expected if there is no natural calamity, said Md Lutfar Rahman, deputy director of DAE regional office in Kushtia. During this correspon-

dent's visit to some areas in Meherpur, Chuadanga and Kushtia, farmers said fertilisers are available this time.

According to DAE sources, the government fixed Tk 1000 per bag (50 kg) of urea, TSP at Tk 110 (which was Tk 600 in last year), DAP at Tk 1350 (which was Tk 1250 in last year) and MoP at Tk 750 (which was same in last year). Farmers, however,

### Libya returnee abducted for ransom freed

A Libya returnee, abducted for ransom in the town four days ago, was rescued early yesterday.

Police said, Azizur Rahman Ujjal, 35, son of Khorshed Alam of Pashchim Jhaogara village in Melandaha upazila of Jamalpur, was abducted from an auto-rickshaw stand on April 19.

The abductors took Ujjal to a remote char of the Jamuna River in Tangail Sadar upazila the same day.

Later, they talked to Ujjal's father Khorshed Alam over cellphone and demanded a ransom of Tk 5 lakh for release of his son. The abductors also threatened to kill Ujjal if the money was murder. not paid.

## Brick kiln continues operation ignoring protest, DoE order

Set amid croplands and only a few metres from a school, this brick field at Rudragram village in Trishal upazila under

Mymensingh district has been continuing illegal operation for over two years.

Nothing could stop the operation of a brick kiln that has been flouting environmental laws, causing air pollution and

affecting farmlands for over two years. Despite protest by locals and order of Department of Environment (DoE) to shut down 'Rehan Bricks', the owner of the brick field continued to burn bricks at Rudragram village in Trishal upazila.

The kiln started its operation in 2010 without taking clearance certificate from the authorities, said Md Abdul Azim, assistant director at DoE in the district.

On March 14 this year, the authorities served a notice on owner Abu Rehan to stop the operation of the kiln as it is located within one kilometre of human habitation and educational institutions, he added.

As per the rule, brick kilns should not be set up within three kilometres of any human habitation, house, road and highway or crop field.

Earlier on January 2, the owner submitted an application to the department seeking certificate while the authorities received another application from locals on January 25 urging to shut the kiln, said Azim.

However, while visiting the spot in March, the DoE officer saw the kiln still burning bricks. He said the authorities would take necessary steps against people responsible for the offence.

local administration gave him permission to run the brick field. However, he could not mention any specific body or official that issued it.

Terming the brick field environment friendly, he said it was causing less harm to people and farmland than any other kilns in the area.

Makbul Hossain, a farmer of Bhati Daspara village, said the kiln had been posing serious environmental threat to locals and affecting soil fertility and

plantations since its inception. Production of fruits and vegetables, including mango and jackfruit, has

sharply fallen in the areas due to burning of bricks at the kiln, he added.

Local social organisations, such as Pachlar Char Samaj Kalyan Samity, Swapnabaz Samity and Avijatrik lodged several complaints with the owners of the brick kiln, but it all went unheeded.

Golam Mustafa, director of Golapkuri Kindergarten, said that the brick field was posing serious health Meanwhile, Rehan claimed that hazard to the students as the school is located only a few yards off the kiln.

"We informed the authorities including local lawmaker Reza Ali, UNO Md Mizanur Rahman and upazila agriculture officer about the matter, but to no effect," he added.

Contacted, the UNO said they would take punitive action against those responsible for the matter after visiting the spot.

According to the sources at DoE, more than 30 brick fields have been set up in the upazila. Of those, 20 are burning firewood, violating rules and polluting environment.

In Dinajpur, two and a half years old twin sons of a man were drowned in a pond in Parbatipur upazila yesterday evening, reports our correspondent.
