Three 'time bombs' recovered in capital

Police recovered three "powerful time bombs" from the capital's Shyampur area yesterday morning, just hours before those were to explode.

Their making and controlling system were similar to those exploded by the now-banned militant organisation Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh on August 17, 2005 in 63 of the country's 64 districts, police said.

Bodies may be exhumed today

Court permits second autopsy

After around two and a half months of the murder of journalist couple Sagar and Runi, a Dhaka court yesterday permitted Rab to exhume the

remains of their bodies from the graves for fresh autop-

sies to reveal the mystery surrounding the homicide. Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Bikash Kumar Saha

passed the order following a petition by Senior ASP Mohammad Zafar Ullah of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab). Court sources said it is likely the remains of the bodies would be exhumed anytime today in presence of

Executive Magistrate Mohammad Shahiduzzaman. Zafar, also the investigation officer (IO) of the case, in his petition said the viscera test reports of the victims were not preserved by the previous IOs. So it was essential to exhume the remains of the bodies for fresh viscera

Baby-lifter caught in camera

There was, however, no footage of the woman leaving the hospital, DMCH sources said, adding that the entire hospital was not under CCTV surveillance.


