Collectivism vs individualism

Rajshahi, Khulna clash in NCL final

It will be a case of Rajshahi's collective effort taking on the individual might of Khulna when the sides meet in the National Cricket League final, which begins today at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium. The five-day game in Mirpur will be shown live on BTVWorld from 9:30am.

The defending champions have a chance to win four first-class tournaments in a row after winning the last three while Khulna was the last team other than Rajshahi to win the tournament, and that was back in the 2007-08 season.

Khulna will rely on the likes of Anamul Haque, Tushar Imran, Soumya Sarkar and Mithun Ali who have scored in excess of 450 runs while Dollar Mahmud, Al-Amin Hossain, Murad Khan and Abdur Razzak have picked up more than 30 wickets. Such performances have helped Khulna remain at the top of the points table and dominate wins and drawn games. Rajshahi however banks on several performers and team spirit which is second to none. Though they have the likes of Mizanur Rahman, Farhad Hossain and Junaed Siddique making the runs, it is the percentage players like skipper Forhad Reza, Jubair Ahmed and the strong

bowling attack comprising of Saqlain Sajib, Sanjamul Islam and Mukhtar Ali which keeps them ahead of the rest.

Rajshahi have so far won seven out of the ten games, losing the other three; clearly, they have a positive approach. "We always set out to win," said Forhad ahead of the game, "but we are up against a good team like Khulna who has several in-form players."

"I think we did lose a few players to Rangpur. Naeem Islam, Dhiman Ghosh and Sohrawardi Shuvo have won a lot of games for Rajshahi but we were always confident that our next lot, the likes of Sabbir Rahman and Sanjamul Islam, have done really well," he added. Interestingly, Rajshahi won the last two finals (after the format was introduced in 2009-10) on the first innings lead.

There will be mini battles aplenty as well with the in-form Anamul expected to be a handful for the disciplined Rajshahi bowlers. The right-handed BKSP alumni who was in the Asia Cup squad has scored plenty of runs this season as well as hitting centuries in the last two of his three innings in domestic cricket. Soumya Sarkar and Imrul Kayes will complement Anamul while skipper Tushar and Mithun are also among runs. Shirfin Hossain Rony netted the other goal in the match where Brothers surprisingly seemed to lack any urgency against a side who were pounded by every other team in the first phase of the league. Interestingly enough, Rahmatganj's four goal haul in this game matched their four-goal haul that they have managed throughout the entire tournament in nine games. A second triumph in 10 matches propped Rahmatganj out of the relegation zone and onto the ninth position with nine points.

It was also the first defeat for Brothers Union since Indian coach Syed Naeemuddin took over charge following their back-to-back losses in the first two games of the league. Under the guidance of Naeemuddin, Brothers had improved their performance gradually and stunned title contenders Muktijoddha Sangsad and Sheikh

BFF polls taken to court

A Dhaka court yesterday asked Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) to explain within 24 hours why the April 30 BFF elections should not be cancelled.

The fourth assistant judge's court of judge Faizunnesa passed the order following a petition jointly filed by Chuadanga district football association president Shafiqul Islam and Gaibandha district football association general secretary Biman Kumar Sarker.

In the petition they sought an order to halt the BFF elections. BFF president Kazi Salahuddin, acting general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag and chief election commissioner Mesbahuddin Ahmed were made respondents in the petition.

The plaintiffs said the acting general secretary of Bangladesh Football Federation is a salaried official and he cannot declare any date of publishing voter lists, date for casting votes and activities. But he had announced a schedule for election, published a voter list and fixed a date for election violating the provisions of Bangladesh Football Federation.

CEC Mesbahuddin said that they would fight the petition legally. "Those who failed to obtain voting rights in the election have filed the petition. However, we will reply to through the legal procedure. We had earlier faced a similar petition at the Jhenaidah court and got the verdict in our favour."

"There is a specific guideline of FIFA to settle issues like this within the jurisdiction of the organisation. If a party is aggrieved, they can take the matter to BFF, then AFC and if
