Ali Aksad's 80th birth anniversary today

Today is the 80th birth anniversary of Ali Aksad, a veteran journalist and expresident of Bangladesh Peace Council, says press release.

On the occasion, Bangladesh Peace Council, now headed by Mujaffar Hossain Poltu as

new president, has paid tributes to him.

Ali Aksad, a former member of the Communist Party, initiated the movement of Bangladesh Peace Council, a chapter of the World Peace Council, in the region. He worked with the daily Sangbad as news editor and with the Ittefaq as an assistant editor.

Aksad was born in 1932 in Hawrah district of India's West Bengal. A trusted associate of Bangabandhu, he brought international support during the country's Liberation War.

The veteran leader passed away on March 6, 2009 in a Dhaka hospital and was buried at the Martyred Intellectuals' Graveyard at Mirpur with state honour.

11 bombs recovered in Savar

Old man beaten, dies

The elderly man, who was beaten mercilessly by the employer of his 13-year-old step daughter, died at Rashmono Hospital in the capital's Moghbazar yesterday. Sohrab Shikder, 65, died at the ICU at around 12:15am.

Police said some gold ornaments went missing from the house of Shahidul Hasan Titu, employer of the 13-year-old domestic help Shammi Akhter, at Block B of Bashundhara residential area. Titu blamed his domestic help Shammi for the stealing.

Sohrab went to the house of Titu from his Badda Mollapara residence on April 24 as the employer called him. At one stage, Titu and his three to four staff beat him severely, poured hot water on him and his step daughter Shammi, said victim's son Kibria Shikder to The Daily Star.

On the day, Titu and his men admitted Sohrab and Shammi to Dhaka Medical College Hospital and left it. Sohrab was later shifted to the Rashmono Hospital by his

son Kibria. A case was filed in this connection accusing four persons, including Titu. Police arrested Abdul Karim, driver of Titu's car.

Hasina also expressed her strong commitment to build an educated nation. "We want our children to become educated...we want to turn the country into a middle-income one by 2021."


She also renewed her pledge to build a "Sonar Bangla" as dreamt by Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

Save MBBS student Chandan

Chandan Kumar Ghosh, a fifth year MBBS student of Sir Salimullah Medical College, has been suffering from "Idiopathic Interacranial Hypertension," a neurological disorder, since long for which he is going to lose niseyesignt.

Physicians said Chandan is going to lose his eyesight due to presence of stored water in his brain that creates much pressure inside the brain.

He is now undergoing treatment in Mercury Hospital, Chennai in India. He needs an immediate surgery to get recovery from the disease. Neurologist Dr Deepak Arjua Das of the hospital said if Chandan's brain surgery is not done within a month, he might be blind permanently.

Hailing from Rajbari district, Chandan is a son of a poor family and it is not possible for them to bear his treatment cost. So, his family requested the generous and well-off of society to extend their hands to save Chandan's life.

Two die in fridge | Stop commercial activities repair shop blast in residential plots

JS body asks Rajuk

Two people died and another two were critically injured after an explosion ripped through a refrigerator repair shop last evening at 82/3, north Jatrabari in the capital.

The deceased are Mohammad Arif, 28, of Islampur village under Burichong upazila in Comilla and Mohammad Helal Uddin, 26, of Chandipur village under Daganbhuiyan upazila in Feni. The injured, Helal Uddin's cousin Mohammad

Zahangir, 35, and Mohammad Shaheen, 25, are undergoing treatment at Dhaka Medical College Hospital. "The explosion was so severe that it ripped pieces of

flesh off the victims," said Mohammad Abul Kashem, officer-in-charge of Jatrabari Police Station. The shop, Mannan Engineering Workshop, immediately caught fire, burning the victims inside, he said, add-

ing that Fire Service and Civil Defence personnel arrived and doused the flames.

The firefighters recovered a liquefied petroleum gas cylinder from the shop which, they suspect, might have exploded while the victims were using it to fire a blowtorch to cut open a refrigerator condenser at around 6:30pm.
