Safety net to include beggars

Govt plans to rehabilitate 2,000 beggars in Dhaka

The government will be rehabilitating 2,000 beggars of the capital city in a pilot project to be implemented by June.

This is the first time such an initiative has been taken up by the ministry of social welfare.

A high-ranking social welfare ministry official said the chosen beggars would be rehabilitated in Mymensingh, Jamalpur, Dhaka and Barisal districts. They would be provided with accommodation and loans for self employment under the pilot project.

Steps required for rehabilitation of the beggars would be decided in an inter-ministerial meeting, he said.


