Teesta deal has to wait

Delhi tells Dhaka; insists no Himalayan rivers to be inter-linked

PALLAB BHATTACHARYA, New Delhi

India has assured Bangladesh that the Himalayan rivers will not be included in its river inter-linking project without prior consultation with Bangladesh, and said an agreement on sharing of the Teesta waters will have to wait till a consensus with West Bengal state is reached.

Addressing a joint media conference with Bangladesh Foreign Minister Dipu Moni after a two-hour first meeting of the Joint Consultative Commission (JCC) here yesterday, Indian External Affairs Minister S M Krishna said the Himalayan rivers are not part of the inter-linking project as of now and even if they are included at a later stage, it will not be done without consultation with Bangladesh.

Dipu Moni said, "India has reassured us -- Finance Minister Pranab Mukherjee in Dhaka yesterday (Sunday) and SM Krishna today-- that the Himalayan river system is not part of the inter-linking project. There will be no unilateral decision without consulting Bangladesh on the issue."

Dhaka, Delhi agree to sign extradition treaty

Bangladesh and India have agreed to conclude an extradition treaty at the earliest and vowed not to allow domestic or foreign militants and insurgents in each other's territories.

A joint statement issued yesterday said Foreign Minister Dipu Moni and her Indian counterpart SM Krishna noted "the legal framework for bilateral security cooperation would be completed with the signing of the extradition treaty".

Both sides agreed to expedite efforts to conclude the treaty at the earliest, said the statement, which followed the first meeting of the Joint Consultative Commission co-chaired by the two ministers in New Delhi.

Allow taka-whitening

CPD suggests govt buck up dismal investment scenario

The government may allow whitening of undisclosed income only after imposing tax plus a penalty, not at a flat tax rate that goes against honest taxpayers, said the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) yesterday.

"The proposal may be considered in light of the stagnated investment environment and to attract new investments," said the CPD in its budget recommendations for fiscal 2012-13.

The civil society think-tank made the suggestion after the government expressed its intention to allow whitening of undisclosed money in the next budget at a 10 percent flat tax rate. "This runs counter to the principle of rewarding conscientious taxpayers and punishing tax evaders and people with undisclosed income," said the CPD.

Although the female examinees in this year's SSC exams outnumbered male students in most general education boards, they failed to match the performance of the males.

The results showed that the pass rate of female students under five general education boards is lower by 3.25 percentage point than the male students. The number of female students was 24,643 more than the male students.

A total of 3,42,626 female students took the exams under Dhaka, Comilla, Chittagong, Barisal, and Sylhet education boards against 3,17,983 male students.

Of them, the pass percentage was 87.03 percent and 84.25 percent for the male and female students respectively.

Also in Rajshahi, Jessore and Dinajpur boards, a lesser number of female students came out successful than the males.

The average pass percentage of SSC, Dakhil and SSC (vocational) examinations under 10 education boards stood at 86.37 percent -- 4.06 percent higher than the last year's.

Like the previous years, lesser number of girl students have become successful this year. The pass percentage of male and female students this year is 87.27 and 85.37 respectively.
