The World Bank may soon cancel its funding for the Padma bridge project, as the government took no effective steps in response to the donor agency's reports on corruption allegations involving the pro-


Getting such a hint from the World Bank, Finance Minister AMA Muhith has taken initiative to find alternative sources

"We do not want to keep any lead financier. We [Bangladesh government] will coordinate [the implementation of the whole project]," he said.

- Prescribed application form will be available in all the branches of Dutch-Bangla Bank.
