ONLINE TAX REFUND

NBR needs more time to finish tasks

Taxpayers will have to wait for one more year to get refunds of their extra payments online as the National Board Revenue (NBR) has not yet completed all tasks.

The revenue authority said the refund of extra payments online requires taxpayers to submit returns online.

A central processing centre (CPC) should also be established to analyse payment information and taxpayers' income for calculating taxes and refund online.

By June next year, these tasks are likely to be complete, enabling taxpayers to get refunds in their accounts automatically and relieve them of the hassles of visiting tax offices to complete formalities, according to the NBR yesterday.

"We are working to establish CPC," said NBR Chairman Nasiruddin Ahmed at a programme on e-payment of taxes at Radisson Water Garden Hotel.

Ahmed spoke while responding to queries of taxpayers on when they will get refund of extra money in their accounts automatically.

Taxpayers, including individual and companies, tax practitioners and chartered accountants attended the programme organised by the NBR to aware stakeholders about its initiative to open e-payment gateway of taxes beginning from May 26. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is expected to inaugurate the

e-payment system which is expected to ease hassles of taxpayers as the method will enable taxpayers, including companies, to pay income tax, value-added tax and customs duties online. The NBR is going to launch the e-payment gateway by

inking a tripartite agreement with Sonali Bank and Q Cash, an electronic fund transfer service provider.

BNP MP Khokon gets bail on surrender

BNP lawmaker Barrister Mahbub Uddin Khokon secured bail till May 20 nearly three hours after his surrender before a Dhaka court yesterday in an arson case.

Metropolitan Magistrate Mohammad Erfanullah granted the bail upon a bond of Tk 10,000 with two grantors. Before final hearing, Taherul Islam Touhid, a counsel of

Khokon, filed a bail petition before the magistrate court immediately after the surrender of the BNP leader.

The metropolitan magistrate passed the bail order after holding a lengthy hearing on the bail petition.

With permission from the court, Khokon said he was not present at the spot during the time of occurrence and a lawmaker like him cannot commit such offences.

Tejgaon police filed the case against Khokon and some other BNP men a couple of hours after a vehicle was torched near the Prime Minister's Office during the April 29 shutdown. Khokon on April 3 secured an anticipatory bail from an HC bench in connection with the case.

Earlier on May 2, two HC judges delivered dissenting orders on the bail petition after he surrendered before it seeking an anticipatory bail in the case.

The presiding judge granted anticipatory bail to Khokon till yesterday and asked him to surrender before the trial court by this period while the other judge rejected his bail petition.

Protect culture for development: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday urged all to stand firm and be united for creating harmonious diversity to provide more colourful, beautiful and peaceful world for future generations.

"Let us stand firm and united in our endeavor for harmonious diversity and let the thousand flowers representing our unique cultural diversities blossom and bloom making our world more colourful, beautiful and peaceful for our children and future generations," she said while inaugurating the Cultural Diversity Ministerial Forum of the Asia-Pacific Region 2012 at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre in the capital.

Hasina also called for sharing each other's culture and heritage that have the strength to overcome the fearsome forces of terrorism, extremism and other challenges facing the globalized world.

She said Bangladesh is one of the few countries whose constitution ensures protection and promotion of diversity of cultural expressions. "Our constitution commits us to identify, evaluate, safeguard, and utilise all our cultural activities, traditional or modern, for aesthetic or economic benefit of our people."

The prime minister said Bangladesh already ratified the Unesco 'Convention on the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions' in 2007.

"I hope all the remaining countries of the Asia-

Pacific region will likewise do the same to protect, promote and enrich their unique cultural expres-She noted that in recent years, there has been a

worldwide recognition of culture as a source of self-

enrichment, sustainable development, poverty eradication, empowerment of the people and their active role in national development. "It has also led to huge cultural industry emerging around the world requiring measures to be

taken for nourishing and protecting indigenous cultural practices." For this, Hasina said, a survey of the cultural

expressions, their evaluation, and intellectual protection of individual countries is essential. "Bangladesh has already conducted such a survey."

She said in cooperation with the World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO), Bangladesh has also conducted a survey of its traditional cultural expressions and found that items like Zamdani, Nakshikantha, Tangail Saree, Muslin silk, Baul and mystic songs, and others contribute significantly to the national GDP.

Most developing countries will benefit in the same way through a survey, she added.

The prime minister said the Asia-Pacific region comprises 60 per cent of the world's population and some of the oldest human civilizations.

"As we experience the ways of life and culture of the peoples of the individual Pacific island countries at one end and the other countries in the dif-

ferent sub-regions of Asia at the other end, we are overwhelmed by the sheer magnitude of beauty, charm and colour of the array of vibrant cultures reflected by the many races, ethnicities, faiths, and heritages comprising the Asia-Pacific Region."

"Indeed," she said, "I believe our cultures do contribute significantly to the beauty of our world and make our lives fulfilling."

Hasina expressed the hope that the Ministeria Forum will help flourish the multi-cultural nature of the region, and strengthen the argument that diversity and unity of world cultures, as defined in the Unesco convention 2005, "is quite in conformity with protecting and preserving our cultural expressions."

"I also believe this Forum on Cultural Diversity will further the cause of tolerance, democracy, human rights, and cumulative cooperation for cultural diversity for realisation of long lasting world peace," she

Later, the prime minister witnessed a cultural programme.

Information and Cultural Affairs Minister Abul Kalam Azad presided over the inaugural session of the three-day event. Ministerial level officials of 44 countries are taking part in the forum.

Director General of Unesco Irina Bokova, Vice President of Kiribati Teima Onorio and State Minister for Cultural Affairs Advocate Promode Mankin also addressed the session. Cultural Affairs secretary Surayia Begum gave the welcome address.



Russia wants to enhance cooperation

Says new envoy

The newly appointed Russian Federation Ambassador to Bangladesh Alexander A Nikolaev has said his country is keen to increase cooperation with Bangladesh.

He made the remark while presenting his credentials to President Zillur Rahman on March 8. Nikolaev has succeeded Ambassador Dr Gennady PTrotsenko.

Prior to his appointment as ambassador to Bangladesh, he had been serving as the deputy director of the Second Asian Department, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation since

Born in 1950, Nikolaev graduated from Moscow State University of International Relations (MGIMO) in 1973 and joined in the diplomatic service the same year.

He worked at the Embassy of the USSR in Vietnam (1973-1977), Embassy of the USSR in the Philippines (1981-1984), Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the European Union in Brussels (1993-1998).

In 1998-1999, Nikolaev headed the Reconstruction Division in the OSCE's Mission to Kosovo (ex-Yugoslavia). In 2003-2008, he served as the Consul General of the Russian Federation in Simferopol and Sevastopol (Crimea, Ukraine).

During the year 2008-2009, he was Head of Division of the Federal Agency for Commonwealth of Independent States' Affairs, Compatriots Abroad, and International Humanitarian Cooperation (Russian Cooperation Agency).

Talks outside JS useless: Nasim

He, however, said BNP joined hands with people who were allegedly involved in war crimes and killing and AL can not sit for talks with these people.

Ahsanullah Master, a freedom fighter, former lawmaker from Gazipur-2 constituency and also a Sramik League leader, was shot dead by miscreants at Noagaon MA Majid Mia High School ground on May 7, 2004.

Later, a court sentenced 22 people to death and six others to imprisonment over the murder.


