

Myanmar urges exiles to return

Myanmar's president has urged the nation's millions-strong diaspora to return, state media reported yesterday, as the country seeks skilled workers to help smooth the passage of reform.

Several million people fled Myanmar's corrupted economy and political repression under army rule, leaving the nation desperately short of professionals to help it manage massive economic and political change.

Pledging to help emigres establish businesses as resource-rich Myanmar braces for a surge of foreign investment and an expected economic boom, President Thein Sein asked migrants who left for "various reasons" to return.

ROW OVER SOUTH CHINA SEA

China denies war preparations

China has denied it is increasing combat readiness in response to a tense territorial row with the Philippines in the South China Sea which has dragged on for more than a month.

The stand-off erupted last month after Philippine authorities detected Chinese ships fishing near the Scarborough Shoal.

They tried to arrest the crew, but were blocked by Chinese surveillance vessels deployed to the tiny rocky outcrop in the South China Sea about 230 kilometres from the Philippines' main island of Luzon.

The two nations have stationed non-military vessels at the shoal since April 8 in an effort to assert their sovereignty over the area.

But China's defence ministry denied military units were getting ready for war, despite warnings in state media that China is prepared to fight to end the stand-off.

"Reports that the Guangzhou military region, the South China Sea fleet and other units have entered a state of war preparedness are untrue," the ministry said in a brief statement on its website late Friday.

Chinese citizens responded by holding far smaller protests outside the Philippine embassy in Beijing on Friday and yesterday, but police have not allowed sustained demonstrations.

A Chinese state-backed newspaper on Saturday accused the Philippines of whipping up nationalism, but it added military conflict in the South China Sea was possible.



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third of the total FDI here, said CPD Executive Director Prof Mustafizur Rahman while presenting a paper on Bangladesh-EU relations.

"Except for the UK and Netherlands, FDI from EU countries has tended to remain low," said Rahman.

Participants said an increased investment from EU companies will benefit both the trading partners since Bangladesh and the EU together make a market of 65 crore (650 million) people.

Saiful Islam, former president of Bangladesh German Chamber of Commerce and Industry, said the EU should encourage its investors to put money in businesses here, as Bangladesh has the potential to become a regional trade and economic hub.

On the government initiative to establish special economic zones, he said the EU should offer assistance for SEZ's infrastructure development and other issues.

Md Fazlul Hoque, former president of Bangladesh Knitwear Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BKMEEA), said European companies can get a huge market in the region by investing in Bangladesh.

Discussants also underscored the need for an increased EU support for skills development of Bangladeshi workers, mitigation of the impacts of climate change, and addressing the problems of malnutrition and gender disparity.

They proposed that the EU should hire more Bangladeshi workers. The bloc is the third biggest source of remittances for Bangladesh to date, mainly for the migrant workers in the UK.

Rehman Sobhan said the EU should support Bangladesh for agrarian reforms and distributing khas land to the landless.

He proposed that the EU should link the issue of market access with the benefit of workers, and said the EU can have provisions

US says will respond to Myanmar reforms

The United States is matching Myanmar's tentative steps toward democracy after decades of harsh military rule with a calibrated re-engagement, aware of the potential for setbacks, a senior US diplomat said on Friday.

Patrick Murphy, the State Department's deputy special representative for Myanmar, said Washington is deepening its engagement with the reformist government, looking at easing more sanctions and likely to appoint a US ambassador "in coming weeks."

"We embrace these changes that are taking place with eyes wide open," he said in remarks at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, a Washington think tank.

Washington was pleased so far with dramatic developments over the past year that have seen the freeing of hundreds of political prisoners, a more liberal media environment and the seating in parliament of democracy icon Aung San Suu Kyi and her

fellow National League for Democracy lawmakers, said Murphy.

But he said the nascent reform process in the former British colony also known as Burma remained a work in progress.

"What it's not, however, is a change that is guaranteed. It's fragile and it's incomplete," said Murphy.

Experts note that poverty is widespread in the resource-rich Southeast Asian country, hundreds of political prisoners remain in jail, the army that ruled the country for 50 years is still at war with some ethnic minority groups, notably in the Kachin state in the north.

"Anything less than stable, prosperous, freer spells trouble for the region and it spells trouble for the country's population of roughly 60 million," said Murphy.

Under an "action for action" policy, Washington has gradually peeled back some of the economic sanctions imposed on Myanmar since 1990, allowing technical assistance by international financial institutions and authorizing financial transactions for selected non-profit projects.

"The government has worsened the relations with foreign countries. The Indian finance minister has told me that they don't want to keep relations with any particular party, rather they want to maintain relations with people," Khaleda continued.
