Shawkat Osman's real name was Sheikh Azizur Rahman. He was one of the leading Bengali litterateurs of the last century. Born in the village Shabolshinghapur, Hooghly, West Bengal in 1917, he started his professional career as a teacher by joining Chittagong Commerce College in 1947. He wrote many novels, short stories, poems, drama, stories and books for children under the penname Shawkat Osman.

He received many awards and accolades including Adamji Sahitya Award in 1962, Bangla Academy Award in 1966, Ekushey Padak in 1983 and the Independence Day

## LALON ATEPICENTRE

Theatre stages Baramkhana

Noted troupe Theatre staged its play on the life and works of Fakir Lalon Shai, "Baramkhana", on May 14 at the National Theatre Hall, Bangladesh Shilpakala

Inspired by Sunil Gangopadhyay's novel "Moner Manush", which saw a film adaptation by Gautam Ghosh as well, the play is a narrative on how Lalon turned into a mystic bard, and moreover, a glimpse o the present day situation at his akhra in Kushtia. The play has been scripted by Pantho Shahriar and directed by Tropa Majumdar, who also played as the narrator.

Lalon's prime concern was to wipe out class strug gle and religious bigotry from society. Through the play, the director raises the question: Is the presentday practice of his philosophy on the right course or is designed the set. it losing its way amid life's many banalities?

The play is divided into two phases. The first phase


narrates Lalon's life. Rather than highlighting his mystic aspect, this part significantly reveals Lalon as a politically and socially aware individual.

The latter phase depicts how people now pay homage to Lalon through organising festivals. This part is more like a satirical depiction through vignettes.

Before the curtain comes down, three large replicas of a wall come down and create a barrier between the performers and the audience. The director uses the wall as a symbol, as she wants to depict how new history develops as the old one remains on the other side of a metaphorical wall. The cast included Rashedul Awal Shaon, Tanjum

Ara Polli, Ershad Hasan, Kawsar Sajib, Kalyan Tahmina Smriti, Abdullah Al Mamun Jewel and Asma Hena. Wahida Mallick Jolly has done the costume designing. Kartik did the music, while Saiful Islam

His performance in the movie "Monpura" cemented his position as an all-rounder actor. A subsequent appearance in the film "'Moner Manush" and numerou TV dramas later, he is now a household name.

Banglavision will air "Haar Kipta", featuring the actor, tonight. The actor talked to The Daily Star about the serial and his other acting assignments

Tell us about "Haar Kipta".

Chanchal: The serial is scripted by Brindabon Das and directed by Salahuddin Lavlu. We have been shooting this serial for over a year now. I play the role of Bohor -- a very funny character. My personal opinion on the serial is that after a long time, I found the combo of a brilliant story and an interesting character.

Where did you shoot for "Haar Kipta"? Chanchal: In Pubail, Gazipur.

You are a frequent face in Salahuddin Lavlu's works. Why is that? Chanchal: First of all, I am a theatre actor, so is

Salahuddin Lavlu. The director prefers to work with Brindabon Das who also comes from a theatre background. Maybe this is the reason why Salahuddin Lavlu can bring out the best from an actor. This may be a reason also why I prefer working with him. And from my experience with him, can say that we hold similar opinions on many things. Now, I work in almost every project of his. What are you working on now?

Chanchal: Several serials. Rtv is airing the serial "Oloshpur"; Boishakhi TV is airing "Pathorer Kanna"; Channel i is telecasting "Lonka Kando"; while I'm also working on a new serial called "Protishodh". Meanwhile, the airing of "Shobuj Nokkhotro" also finished recently. I also plan on working on a new serial by Syed Shakil, which has been written by Brindabon Das.

Why do you usually choose dramas set in rural Chanchal: The directors can answer this better. It is they who cast me in the roles. But I'm more

comfortable in rural roles, as I grew up in a village.


