The two companies -- ruling Awami League lawmaker Saber Hossain Chowdhury's Karnaphuli Works Ltd, and Sharika Traders Ltd -obtained the licences under some new terms and conditions enforced since March 2011 to streamline the cab service.

Taxicab service is in a dismal state in the city with only 2,000 rundown cabs in operation. Although 11,260 taxis were registered with Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) in 1998, most of the cabs have been discarded for failure to meet standard fitness

UTTARA MODEL TOWN Plot winners pressed to pay more

The Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) is taking around Tk 28 crore extra from the plot winners of the extended Uttara residential town through verbal communication and without any official announcement.

Rajuk's estate department officials have verbally asked the plot winners to pay an amount at 12 percent rate on the third installment, although the final allotment letter says nothing about such payment. The amount has been dubbed as "fees" for paying the

price of the plots in installments. But this would put unforeseen financial pressure on the plot winners.

The final allotment letter issued to each plot winner in 2007 says the plot winners could pay the price either at a time or in installments without any precondition of "fees" to obtain the installment facility.

Speaking anonymously, a plot winner said Rajuk officials have asked them verbally to pay the extra amount to get possession of the land.
