

# CNG stations now to stay

four-hour shutdown schedule from Tuesday," Zakir Hossain Nayan, president of Bangladesh CNG Filling Station and Conversion Workshop Owners' Association, told UNB yesterday.

He said the association leaders had a meeting with Petrobangla officials on May 16 where the authorities concerned endorsed the new shutdown schedule.

Petrobangla Chairman Dr Hussain Mansur could not be reached for comments in this regard despite repeated attempts to con-

tact him last evening. The power and energy ministry in March at a high-level meeting decided that all CNG stations across the country would remain shut for 6 hours to enhance gas supply to the power plants mainly to provide extra electricity supply for irrigation during the Boro season.

Last year, the 4-hour shutdown at CNG stations was introduced as part of a gas-rationing plan against the backdrop of severe gas and electricity crises.

The meeting on May 16 decided that the 6-hour shutdown would remain effective only for two months and after the expiry of the period, the 4-hour shutdown at CNG stations would be reintroduced.

Referring to the decision, Nayan said since the decision was given effective for two months it did not need any further order to reintroduce the 4-hour shutdown schedule.

"So, we're going back to our 4-hour shutdown schedule," he added.

# RANGAMATI BLAST It was bomb, not grenade

An explosion that injured 14 activists of Pahari Chhatra Parishad (PCP), a hill students' organisation, in Rangamati town on Saturday was caused by a hand-made bomb, not a grenade as alleged and reported in different media, police said yesterday.

Saiful Islam, officer-in-charge (OC) of Kotwali Police Station, said the information was confirmed by the army's explosives experts of Rangamati zone who examined the residues of the blast.

"We could not find any clue about the blast why and who might have been behind it. However, police are trying to trace the motive of the explosion," the OC continued.

No case was filed so far, he added.

The OC earlier said they got a few splinters of the bomb including rubber and iron, "which are usually seen in a grenade".

The blast took place near Kalyanpur Petrol Pump around 4:00pm Saturday when the activists of PCP, backed by Parbatya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (PCJSS), were waiting for transport to return to Kaptai after attending the organisation's 23rd founding anniversary and the 17th council at Rajbari Stadium in the town.

The organisation claims the bomb was hurled from the nearby main road where three CNG-run auto-rickshaws stopped at the time of incident.

Meanwhile, three of the seven critically injured who were sent to Chittagong Medical College Hospital Saturday were shifted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital yesterday as their conditions were stated to be critical, said Trizinaad Chakma, PCP office secretary, central unit.

They are Jibon Chakma, Babudhan Chakma, and Kamonashis Chakma.

In protest, PCJSS in a press release, signed by Sajib Chakma, assistant information secretary of its central unit, blamed the anti-peace treaty forces for the attack.

# Curbs on water

of river and other water bodies and their banks.

As per the proposed act, water resources of all surface and ground water, including rivers, canals, beels, haors, baors, and other water bodies, and continuous and intermittent water fall and the maritime water will be state property.

The government will distribute the water based

on national and local interests and availability of the surface and ground water. In distribution of water, drinking water supply, household work, agriculture, fisheries, environment, wildlife, water transport, industries, con-trolling of salinity, power generation, and entertainment, among others, will get priority.

The law will not, however, curb the rights of any citizen

to use water for household and agricultural work. But the government will have the authority to preserve any pond in the coastal belt or where there is a crisis of drinking water.

Two committees -- one headed by the prime minister and the other headed by the water resources minister -- will be formed to supervise the implementation of the law.

# Hold 2pc share

and to create a buying pressure in the stock market for the benefit of general investors.

In a circular issued on November 22 last year, the stock regulator made it compulsory for the sponsors, directors and promoters to acquire at least a 2 percent stake individually and a 30 percent stake jointly in their firms within six months.

An HC bench yesterday delivered the verdict after rejecting petitions filed by some directors and aspirant directors of three listed firms. The petitioners had challenged the legality of the SEC circular.

Following the verdict, Additional Attorney General Murad Reza told reporters that the court declared the SEC directive legal for the interest of the market and investors.

Now, some 950 directors, who hold less than 2 percent stake in their firms, have to buy shares to keep their directorships since the six-month deadline set by the SEC ends today.

As of yesterday, some 550 directors bought shares to meet the regulatory requirement. Share prices on the trading floor also returned to the black from the last few days' downward trend following the court order.

With the verdict, the SEC has no bar to taking the next course of action on minimum shareholding, Murad said.

The court yesterday also lambasted the stock market regulator for wording errors in the November 22 circular. It instructed the SEC to issue a fresh circular, correcting the mistakes.

The verdict has settled the issue on minimum

shareholding, DSE President Rakibur Rahman said.

"Sponsors and directors of the listed firms pocketed huge money through selling their stakes when the market was at its peak, but they did not support the market through buying when the market was in crisis following last year's price debacle.

"Now the sponsors and directors will have to quit their posts if they don't comply with the regulatory directive on minimum shareholding," he added.

There are allegations that many sponsors and directors sold off shares, but they still hold the controlling power of the company. "Despite having low percentage of shares, the sponsors and directors make important decisions about the company and enjoy all benefits," Rakibur Rahman said.

# Child lock

children from going online, texting or calling during certain hours.

Unlike an app, a child will not be able to switch the service off. The UK's Family and Parenting Institute said the SIM would help protect children from mobile phone bullying.

To have the service, parents would need to buy a "safety pack" with a SIM card inside, install it into the child's phone.

"It's a SIM that is just like any other SIM you would buy for any other network, but it enables parents to have full control in the context of safety," Simon Goff, founder and chairman of Bemilo, told the BBC.

"They can allow or disallow certain contacts to call them, and they can set the times of day the phone can operate."

For instance, he explained, if parents wanted to switch off the phone during school hours, they could do so remotely from a website on their computer.

But even if nearly all the functions on the child's phone are disabled, parents can always manage the handset in such a way that they are able to reach their children, and the child is able to contact them.

Parents would also be able to read their child's texts, added Goff.

The service could help prevent mobile phone bullying and "sexting" - when a child is subjected to unwanted phone calls or texts.

It could also prevent a child, especially a teenager, from visiting websites parents deem offensive.

"If you put a child to bed, and we're talking about young adults here, those who are just under 16 years old, the parents often think they've gone to bed - but then they find out that they're texting very late into the night or accessing the web into the night," said Goff.

made accused in the case.

Police filed the case on April 29 accusing the 45 opposition leaders of arson attack after a vehicle was torched near the Prime Minister's Office during hartal hours.

Irked by the court order, members of Jatiyatabadi Ainjibi Forum, a platform of pro-BNP lawyers, hurled abusive words at the magistrate in the courtroom and brought out a procession at the court premises.

They announced a boycott of all judge's and magistrate's courts in Dhaka today to protest the court order against Khokon, joint secretary general of the BNP. They will also wear black badges in courts across the country today.

Noakhali district BNP declared a dawn-to-dusk hartal for today in the district to protest the court order against Khokon.

Meanwhile, the main

opposition BNP strongly protested the court order to send Khokon to prison and demanded the unconditional release of all opposition leaders without delay.

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia on Sunday said ruling party men, not opposition activists, were responsible for the arson attack.

On May 10, detectives pressed charges against the acting BNP secretary general and 44 other leaders and activists of the BNP-led 18-party alliance in the arson attack case.

Of the accused, Fakhru and 32 others were sent to jail on May 16. Police earlier arrested BNP Joint Secretary General Ruhul Kabir Rizvi Ahmed and seven others, who were also sent to prison.

Metropolitan Magistrate Mohammad Erfanullah yesterday turned down a petition from Fakhru Islam Alamgir, who claimed the court could

not accept the charge sheet because the owner of the torched bus had not filed any case against the accused.

The court directed the officer-in-charge of Tejaoga Police Station to submit by June 6 reports on the arrest warrants against the three absconding Jamaat leaders.

**BNP'S PRESS BRIEFING**  
Tariquul Islam, standing committee member of the BNP, demanded the unconditional release of opposition leaders, and said the government's strategy to weaken the opposition by repression and cases would not do it any good.

"The Awami League's shameful downfall is just a matter of time. It will be ousted from power through a mass uprising," he said at a press briefing at the BNP's central office in the capital.

The BNP leader said the party's senior leaders, including its acting secre-

tary general, were passing miserable days in Kashimpur jail. "It is wrong policy to resort to repression against the opposition. The government has to pay for it in the future," he said.

Party leaders Nazrul Islam Khan, Abdullah Al Noman and Zainul Abidin Farroque, among others, were present.

**Our Noakhali Correspondent** reports the district BNP called a dawn-to-dusk hartal for today in Noakhali protesting the court order against Khokon, the BNP lawmaker from Noakhali-1 constituency.

At least 10 buses were vandalised during the BNP's demonstrations in Noakhali yesterday.

BNP leaders and activists brought out a procession from Sonaimuri and blocked the Sonaimuri-Dhaka and Chatkhil-Dhaka highways for an hour from 1:30pm.

consulted our counsels about possible legal action against Faruque's unlawful return," said Mahub-ul-Karim, chief executive officer of Proshika, one of the largest non-governmental organisations in the country.

He said they were in contact with grassroots staff about their future course of action.

Following a month-long protest by its general staff, the nine-member governing body removed Faruque

as its chairman in May 2009 on allegations of massive financial and administrative irregularities, nepotism and misusing the NGO's organisational strength for political gains.

Faruque regained his reign over Proshika on Sunday with assistance from his loyal employees, law enforcement agencies and some ruling party men, complained Proshika officials.

As most of the management members did not turn

up at the office for the second consecutive day yesterday, Faruque stayed there without any trouble.

Earlier the High Court in an order said he could only visit the organisation alone as its former chairman.

Mahub claimed that they could not resist Faruque as he entered Proshika's head office in the capital's Mirpur before normal office hours.

Regarding the allegation of selling a Porshika land in Savar by his management,

Mahub said the governing body had decided to sell the property in compliance with organisational rules and all the transactions in this regard have been recorded.

Contacted, Nargis Jahan Banu, an ousted director of the NGO, said they ran the office as usual but many staff were absent.

She admitted receiving support from some staff and ruling Awami League men in taking control of the office.
