Three shops fined

Three shops, found selling adulterated fruits, were fined Tk 1.55 lakh by mobile courts in separate drives in the capital yesterday.

The courts also seized around 400 kg adulterated fruits from the shops.

A mobile court, led by Executive Magistrate Rashelul Kader, detected calcium carbide in mangoes and formalin in grapes of the superstore Prince Bazar Limited in Mohammadpur and fined the shop Tk 1 lakh and destroyed 80 kg mangoes and 4 kg grapes of the shop.

The court also fined the superstore Agora in Dhanmondi Tk 50,000 and destroyed 160 kg mangoes of the shop after detecting calcium carbide in mangoes.

In another drive, a mobile court, led by Executive Magistrate Morazi Deshai Barman, fined the owner of Messers Billal Shasha Bhandar in Shewrapara Tk 5,000 after detecting calcium carbide in mangoes of the shop. The court also destroyed 100 kg mangoes there.

Dhaka district administration and Bangladesh Standards and Testing Institution jointly conducted the drives.

The victim was taken to DMCH to conceal the "killing," he added.

PDB takes possession of 246.99 acres of land

CPA had leased out the land to two private companies

The Power Development Board (PDB) in Chittagong yesterday took possession of 246.99 acres of government land in Anwara upazila that was under the custody of Chittagong Port Authority (CPA), who had leased it out to two private companies.

The land in Rangadia and Majher Char across the Karnaphuli river will be used to house a 1,320MW coal-fired power plant, said Ilias Rahman, executive engineer of PDB.

The government has allotted the PDB the land to set up the power plant.

Md Shamsuddin Khan, a senior deputy manager of AK Khan Co Ltd, said around 200 acres of land was taken from their possession. He claimed that the PDB did not serve any notice for taking possession of the land. "We will deal with the matter legally".

Asked, the PDB executive engineer said the companies were served notices three times.

Zahirul Hoque, manager (accounts) of East West Property Development Ltd, the other lessee, said about 46 acres of land was taken from its posses-

He claimed that the company took lease of 246 acres of land from the CPA in 2006 for 50 years to establish

an oil refinery. It has already invested about Tk 500 crore to develop the Char land to set up the factory, he added. He alleged that the PDB did not issue

any notice about taking possession of the land. Enamul Gofran Chowdhury, a project director of East West Property

Development Ltd, however, said the

firm was not sure how much land was taken back from it. He said the company was not informed of the drive, and by measuring the land, it would confirm if the PDB actually took possession of its

During the drive with the assistance of the Chittagong District Administration (CDA) and police, the staffers of a one-storey office of AK Khan Co Ltd in the land were evicted yesterday.

Govt to be ousted thru' mass upsurge

Say BNP leaders

Accusing the government of influencing the court, BNP leaders yesterday said the government will be defeated through mass upsurge and its policy to weaken the opposition through arresting their leaders will be boomerang soon.

"The policy to arrest opposition leaders will not bring any good for the government as the people did not take it easily. All the leaders will come out of jail soon through legal battle. But it is nothing else but the street, which will define final results," said Moudud Ahmed, a senior member of BNP standing committee.

He made the remarks at a human chain programme before the Jatiya Press Club organised by Daudkandi Jatiyatabadi Forum, a pro-BNP body, demanding release of the opposition leaders.

Moudud, also a senior lawyer, said no one among the opposition leaders was present when a bus was torched during the hartal hours though all of them are in jail in the arson case.

Tariqul Islam, another member of the standing committee, said the judiciary cannot work independently due to the government interference and urged all to be united against the government's "torture and repression" on the opposition men.

"The government has turned into an autocrat. They want to establish one party rule. But we won't accept it. They have to quit power through mass upsurge," he said while addressing a protest rally in front of the BNP central office organised by Jatiyatabadi Juba Dal.

More time needed to trace Ilias: Shahara

Over a month into his disappearance, Home Minister Shahara Khatun yesterday sought more time to trace missing BNP leader M Ilias Ali.

The home minister said an investigation into the disappearance is underway and law enforcement agencies are trying hard to locate him. The government is still hopeful of finding him but more time is needed. She was replying to queries from journal-

ists after inaugurating a three-day workshop at a hotel in the capital. Former BNP lawmaker Ilias Ali and his

driver Ansar Ali went missing in the wee hours of April 18. Shahara also urged the opposition party

to shun politics of destruction. "People do not like destructive activities," she said. The International Search and Rescue

Advisory Group (INSARAG) organised the workshop on disaster management in Saarc nations at Ruposhi Bangla Hotel.

Earlier at the inaugural programme

Shahara said, "At present Bangladesh is putting together a regional plan of action to fight natural hazards, particularly earthquake."

An agreement on rapid response to natural

disaster has been signed in the Saarc 17th Summit to ensure that no member state is overwhelmed by a natural calamity, she added.

The home minister said through Comprehensive Disaster Management Programmes, the government has conducted safety and evacuation drills in more than 100 schools and plans to insert such drills in the school curriculum so that children can learn to respond quickly during an earthquake.

She also said that the government is in the process of preparing 62,000 volunteers for conducting rescue operation in urban areas after an earthquake. So far 25 percent people of the target number is trained. Disaster Management and Relief Division

Secretary Dr M Aslam Alam said Dhaka is in high risk of earthquakes and he hopes that Saarc Disaster Management Centre will help to fight such disasters should they arise.

Dr Satendra IFS, executive director of Saarc Disaster Management Centre, Neal Walker, UN resident coordinator, were present among others at the ceremony, which was presided over by Brig Gen (Retd) Abu Nayeem Md Shahidullah, director general of July 15. Fire Service and Civil Defence.

Road block, vandalism

Agitated garment workers yesterday torched and vandalised at least five buses and barricaded the Dhaka-Sylhet Highway for over an hour after a coworker was killed by a speeding bus. At least 10 people were injured in a clash between the

workers of the apparel factory and the police which ensued as police tried to bring the situation under control. Sonia, 22, a worker of Sinha Garments was run over by a bus in front of the factory at Sonargaon in Narayanganj

around 9:30am. She died on the spot. Moments after her death, angry workers took to the

streets and placed barricades on the highway and set fire to a number of buses. Police charged batons on the workers who hurled brick-

bats at the law enforcers, leaving 10 people injured. The police even fired a couple of shots in the air to bring the situation under control around 10:30am, said Mahbubul Alam, director of Industrial Police-4 of Adamji.

Additional police personnel have been posted in the area to avoid further agitation.

Meanwhile, following an earlier clash between police and factory workers on Monday, the authorities of Sinha Garments had declared the factory closed for an indefinite period.

At least 20 people, including five law enforcers were injured in the clash which ensued as the workers were protesting the termination of a coworker.

HC asks ACC to probe allotment process

The High Court yesterday directed the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) to immediately launch a thorough investigation to find out whether there was any corruption in the process of allotting plots in the capital's Begunbari-Hatirjheel area.
