

Indian law minister due tomorrow

Indian Law Minister Salman Khurshid will arrive in Dhaka tomorrow (Thursday) on a four-day visit to join the joint celebrations by Bangladesh and India of the 113th birth anniversary of National Poet Kazi Nazrul Islam and to mark the 90th anniversary of the publication of "Bidrohi".

He will lead a delegation, which will include Dr. Bhola Singh and Chongshen Mongkosungkum Chang, members of parliament of

the Lok Sabha. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will formally inaugurate the two-day celebration on Friday morning at the Bangabandhu International Conference Centre where the Indian Minister for Law and Justice and Minority Affairs Salman Khurshid will be present as the guest of

honour. Similar celebrations would be held at Kolkata and Burdwan in India later this year, said a press release of Indian High Commission in Dhaka yesterday.

The joint celebrations are in pursuance of the decision taken by the prime ministers of India and Bangladesh on September 6-7, 2011 in Dhaka.

The joint celebrations in Dhaka will include participation of eminent Indian artists and Nazrul literary experts including Dr Badhon Chandra Sengupta, Prodip Ghosh (Poetry Recitation), Sushmita Goswami and Nabaroon Bhattacharjee (Nazrul Geeti).

During the visit, Salman Khurshid is expected to call on the Bangladesh leadership, the press release added.

Proshika body formed after Faruque's removal still valid

The governing body of Proshika, formed following the removal of the then chairman Qazi Faruque Ahmed, at a press conference claimed itself as the present legitimate authority of the NGO as per the judgment of the highest court. Mahbub-ul-Karim, chief executive officer

of Proshika, read out a written statement at the press conference at Dhaka Reporters Unity yesterday on behalf of the governing body, the highest policymaking council of Proshika. Faruque, the ousted chairman of

Proshika, took control of the organisation's head office early Sunday, three years after he was forced out of it, thus violating a judgement of the court. Faruque continued for the third day yesterday in office without any trouble. "We have been running the organisation

legally for the last three years after the removal of Qazi Faruque by the then governing body," said Mahbub. Prof AM Muazzam Hussein was elected

Faruque in May 2009 on charges of massive financial and administrative irregularities, manipulating organisational strength for political gain and nepotism. Faruque challenged the governing body

district judge but both the courts turned down his pleas. He then moved the High Court that in a judgement ordered status quo at the organsiation saying Faruque could enter the Proshika office alone as a former chairman

Bangladesh Delta Plan 2100 taken

MoU signed with Netherlands

The government has embarked on preparing a fifty to hundred years' long "Bangladesh Delta Plan 2100" to deal with issues like climate change, water resources management, river dredging and construction of embankment in a coordinated manner.

"The very mega plan will be like the one of the Netherlands' Delta Plan as characteristics of both the countries resemble", Planning Minister AK Khandker told reporters during a press briefing at National Economic Council (NEC) in the capital.

With the assistance of the Dutch government, a Delta Commission will be formed to implement the mega plan.

The two countries signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to this end yesterday, which would focus on strategic partnership in the fields of sustainable delta management, integrated water resources management, disaster management, and adaptation to climate change.

The planning minister and visiting Dutch Minister for Development Dr Ben Knapen signed the MoU on behalf of their respective sides at the Prime Minister's Office (PMO). Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina witnessed the management, and disastermanagement. signing ceremony.

had taken various plans like national water management plan, integrated costal management plan, haor master plan, national water resources management plan, but they failed to bring desired development in the country.

"Moreover, we have wasted many resources to implement those single-unit plans", he added. "That's why the government has taken the holistic approach, encompassing different sectors like agriculture, fisheries, industry, forestation, water management, and sanitation".

The main theme of "Bangladesh Delta Plan 2100" will be water resources management in consideration of climate change effects, he said.

The Bangladesh government will formulate and implement the plan.

Earlier, the Dutch minister called on the prime minister at the PMO, when Hasina sought Dutch assistance in river dredging, reclaiming of land, construction of embankment, creating greenbelt in coastal region, and other climate change adaptation and mitigation programmes.

She also sought the Dutch government's technical and financial assistance regarding Bangladesh Delta Plan 2100 aimed at sustainable delta management, integrated water resources
