### Villager shot dead by robbers

A villager was shot dead by a gang of armed robbers at village Noagaon under Jalalabad Police Station here early hours of yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Bashir Uddin, 65,

son of Abul Hashim. Locals and police said the robbers numbering 10 to 12 attacked the house of expatriate Abdul Kahir Chowdhury at about 3:30am yesterday. The miscreants tied inmates up of the house with ropes and looted valuables worth about Tk 10 lakh in cash and gold ornaments.

Bashir was bullet hit in his chest while the robbers were fleeing firing shots at the villagers, leaving him dead on the spot, police said.

Officer-in-Charge Gausul Alam said the body was handed over to the family of Bashir after autopsy at the Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hopsital yesterday afternoon. Police picked up one person for

### Journos' sit-in for 8th Wage Board May 31

Sangbadik-Sramik-Karmachari Oikya Parishad (SSKOP) yesterday deferred its information ministry sit-in programme until May 31.

## Surface plants to meet 70pc water demand

Says Dhaka Wasa MD

Dhaka Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (Wasa) will be able to collect 70 percent water from surface water treatment plants within 2021, significantly reducing the dependency on the fast depleting underground water reserves, Managing Director Taqsem A Khan said yesterday.

"We have already taken a decision to increase the number of surface water treatment plants, considering the falling underground water level. We have taken four projects for this plan, while one was implemented and the rest will be executed gradually", he said.

Dhaka Wasa is now collecting 87 percent water from the underground sources and only 13 percent from the surface water treatment plants, Taqsem told The Daily Star when asked.

Earlier, he told a seminar yesterday that Wasa shifted its focus from underground water treatment plants to surface water plants to protect the environmental balance. Bangladesh Paribesh Andalon (Bapa)

### Next polls must under non-party govt: Tariqul

UNB, Dhaka

BNP top-ranking leader Tariqul Islam yesterday said the next general election would definitely be held under

anon-party government. Addressing a demonstration, BNP standing committee member Tariqul said the country's 16 crore people wanted elections under a non-party and neutral government. "Only ruling Awami

League does not want it." Jatiyatabadi Sramik Dal, the associate labour wing of the main opposition, organised the demonstration in front BNP's Naya Paltan central office in the after-

noon demanding trace of 'missing' party leader M Ilias Ali and release of the top detained leaders of the BNP and its allies. Tarigul also reacted to the remarks of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday when she hinted that the next general elections would be held under the partisan

government. She also said the Election Commission would be empowered claiming that 5,175 elections, including the by-polls and the local government ones, held so far under her government were fair.

He questioned whether the by-elections in Bhola and Brahmanbaria were neutral and fair.

Blaming the government for its failure to meet the people's expectation, and misdeeds and anarchy, the former state minister urged the government to announce election immedi-

"As early as the government announces the election, a democratic situation will be created in the country. Otherwise, its injustice and anarchy will be washed away through movement,"

he warned. Presided over by Sramik Dal President Abul Kashem, the protest rally was also addressed by senior party leaders including Nazrul Islam Khan, Abdullah Al Noman, M Shahjahan and

Jafrul Hasan.

### Ferry fare hike to push up commodity prices Say businesspeople as BIWTC starts charging increased fares

Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Corporation (BIWTC) started charging a 10 percent increase in ferry fares from yesterday, while businesspeople and road transport owners say the rise will eventually push up the prices of commodities and fares of passenger vehicles.

On March 31, the state-run BIWTC announced that it would increase 25 percent fare for ferrying vehicles and 35 percent for passengers from April 10 on different river routes.

The announcement drew strong opposition from owners of road transports, who denied giving 25 percent increased fare at a time, ultimately forcing the corporation to agree to a ten percent increase. The 35 percent increase in passenger fares however was dulyimplemented.

"After negotiations between the April 10.

shipping ministry and road transport owners, it was decided that BIWTC would charge a ten percent increased fare from May 26 for ferrying vehicles", BIWTC spokesperson Nazrul Islam Misha told The Daily Star.

The fares for transporting vehicles on BIWTC ferry vessels were increased to Tk 1,452 from Tk 1,320 on Paturia-Dauladia route, to Tk 1,848 from Tk 1,680 on Mawa-Charjanajat, and to Tk 1,425 from Tk 1,285 on Laharhut-Veduria route for each single trip, sources said.

Gopal Krishna Majumdar, assistant general manager of BIWTC Barisal station, confirmed that the passengers of BIWTC vessels on 169km long Dhaka-Barisal route had been paying Tk750instead of Tk565 for one first class cabin seat, Tk 450 instead of Tk 355 for one second class cabin seat, and Tk 120 instead of Tk 95 for each deck seat from

He claimed that fares had been increased after four years since 2008, and the fares were still lower than that of the private launches, which charge Tk 850 for per first class cabin seat, Tk 400-450 per sofa seat, and Tk 150-180 per deck seat on the same route.

The BIWTC claimed losses in passenger vessels, blaming increasing prices of fuel and costs of operating, repairing, management and maintenance of the old vessels. Requesting anonymity, a BIWTC source however alleged gross corruption in this sector.

The BIWTC has been earning profit in the ferry sector since 2001, and earned Tk 210 core in last fiscal year, including Tk 33 core as net profit, said Gopal Krishna.

However, considering the fuel price hikes and implementation of a new payscale, the BIWTC has decided to increase fares as the operating cost has

increased to Tk 40 core from Tk 20 core within a year, he added. The BIWTC transports fewer pas-

sengers than private transport organisations on Barisal-Dhaka-Barisal route, but ferrying of vehicles and cargo transporting are totally under its control. So increase in ferry fares will cer-

tainly raise fares of passenger buses and cargo trucks and prices of goods, said Saidur Rahman Rintu, president of Barisal Chamber of Commerce and Industry, talking to this correspondent on Friday. Barisal Nagarik Samaj member

secretary Mizanur Rahman feared that the 10-35 percent rise of ferry and passenger fares at one time might not ensure better passenger services on the route, as the authorities concerned were just considering profit rather than services.

## CU student jumps off building Nephew beats to escape BCL men

A Chittagong University (CU) student yesterday jumped from a dormitory building and was injured allegedly while escaping from the captivity of some Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists.

The injured, Abul Hasnat, hailed from Mirsarai upazila in Chittagong and residing at Nayabazar in the port city, was a student of international relations department of CU and the former general secretary of CU Mirasarai Students' Association.

Hasnat said he went to the Faculty of Social Science to take part in his fourthyear final exam around 10:30am when some BCL activists forced him onto a rickshaw and took him to the fourth floor of Shahjalal Hall of the university," said

Hasnat. "The activists led by BCL leader Rakib started to beat me and tried to lock me in a room. Getting a chance, I fled from the room. When I reached the second floor, I jumped from the building as the activists

were chasing me," he told The Daily Star over the phone.

He was rushed to the university medical centre and, later, shifted to Chittagong Medical College Hospital for better treatment.

Hasnat said the BCL activists were forcing him to give them Tk 40,000 of the CU Mirsarai Students' Association that he held in his possession. The association President Salim Uddin

Riman, however, denied Hasnat's claim, saying that "Hasnat had intention to embezzle Tk 70,000 of the association's money and we tried to convince him several times to return the money." He also said Hasnat was injured after

falling from the dormitory stairs. Hathazari police said there is disagree-

ment between the current body of the association and Hasnat. Some members of the association, who

had tried to realise the money from Hasnat a few days ago, made another attempt yesterday with the help of some BCL activists, police added.

# uncle to death

A man was beaten to death by his nephew and accomplices at Purba Nakhalpara in the capital early Saturday.

Dulal Miah, sub-inspector of Tejgaon Industrial Police Station, said Suruj Miah, 35, and his nephew Asadul Islam, 30, locked into an altercation in front of their residences over a family matter at around 1:00 am. At one point, Asadul and his accomplices beat Suruj indis-

criminately, resulting in Suruj Miah's death a few hours later. On information, police recovered the body and picked up

three people--Asadul, Ashraful Islam, 25, and Taslima Begum, 26--for interrogation. Suruj Miah's brother-in-law Ariful Islam told The Daily

Star that Asadul beat his father Chan Miah - Suruj Miah's elder brother - on Friday night during a family altercation. When Suruj Miah returned from work at a garments fac-

tory, neighbours informed him of the incident. He then rushed to the spot and slapped Asadul. Asadul returned an hour later with six to seven accomplices and they beat up Suruj. After Asadul and his group left, wounded Suruj went

He died at around 1.30 am. The body has been sent to Dhaka Medical College morgue for autopsy.

home and complained of severe pain in his chest and body.

Another nephew of the victim, Rakib Hossain, filed a case in this connection.
