Registered primary schools to be nationalised: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday announced that the government had agreed in principle to nationalise all registered primary schools of the country in three phases.

She said she had directed the authorities concerned to frame a policy for the nationalisation of registered nongovernment primary schools for further development of the country's primary education.

There are some 22,961 non-government registered primary schools across the country with 90,000 teachers and 41 lakh students.

JSD questions govt role

Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD) yesterday said that the failure to identify the killers of Sagar and Runi and the disappearance of Ilias Ali has raised questions about the role and administration of the present government.

Moreover, incidents of disappearances, crossfire and encounters have made efforts by the government to establish rule of law in the country controversial, party leaders said at a meeting of JSD's national committee.

JSD President Hasanul Haque Inu, General Secretary Sharif Nurul Ambia and Executive President Moinuddin Khan Badal were present at the meeting held at the party's central office in the capital, said a press release.

At the meeting, party leaders called on main opposition BNP to propose possible alternatives to interim government system, as there are no prospects of reinstating the traditional caretaker government system.

The BNP's lack of sincerity in discussing the issue has made an acceptable national election uncertain, the leaders observed.

They also called on the government to formulate electricity use policies and buying rice straight from farmers due to low market prices, the release said.

closureof re-rolling mills, fines Tk 40 lakh

Environment department ordered closure of two steel re-rolling mills at Demra in the capital yesterday on charge of polluting air and other anomalies.

Mohammad Munir Chowdhury, director of Department of Environment (DoE), handed down the penalty and fined them Tk 40 lakh as an enforcement team detected those had been running for a decade without environmental clearance.

The mills penalised were Mohana Steel and Re-rolling Mill Ltd and Zahir Steel and Re-rolling Mills Ltd.

The steel mills are regarded as 'red category' industries in the environmental conservation law and highly pollutant and hazard-ous for environment, but the owners have been operating the mills without setting up legally mandatory fume extraction system.

They had so far released more than one lakh cubic meters of polluted air containing metals like lead and chromium extremely hazardous for public health, said Munir, adding that an instant examination found 725 microgram suspended particles in the local air while tolerable level in Bangladesh was 200 micrograms.

The mill owners also evaded Tk 20 lakh government revenue, he said.

The DoE director fined Mohana Steel and Re-rolling Mill owner Haji Nurul Islam Tk 25 lakh and Zahir Steel and Re-rolling Mills owner Md Zahirul Islam Tk15 lakh.

He also ordered closure of the mills and wrote to Board of Investment, Bangladesh Bank and Power Development Board for cancellation of the mills' registration, bank loan and electricity connection.

"Pollution level in the steel mill sector is dreadful," he told The Daily Star, "Entrepreneurs in the sector cannot be rectified without stringent enforcement of law."

5 fruit shops fined for adulteration STAFF CORRESPONDENT

A mobile court yesterday fined five fruit shops at Shantinagar in the capital Tk 50,000 for selling adulterated fruits and destroyed 150 kg adulterated mangoes.

While conducting a drive, the court led by Executive Magistrate Abu Sayed detected the presence of calcium carbide and formalin in the mangoes of these shops.

The court fined Tk 10,000 to each of the shops -Messers Shahid Fal Bhandar, Shahzahan Foods, Abdur Rashid Food Store, Karim Kutir and Siraj Food and destroyed 150 kg mangoes of the shops, said BSTI a press release.

Dhaka district administration and Bangladesh Standards and Testing Institution (BSTI) jointly conducted the drive.
