AFP, Nottingham

West Indies' latest top-order collapse left England on the brink of a series-clinching victory in the second Test at Trent Bridge here on Sunday.

The tourists had slumped to 61 for six in their second innings at stumps on the third day.

That gave them a lead of just three runs after England had made a first innings 428 featuring captain Andrew Strauss's second hundred in as many Tests.

Chowdhury said football is the most followed sport in our country despite the fact that the game has lost a lot of gloss and popularity in the domestic front.

"We have invited a few former footballers here who are now holding important posts in the BFF [Bangladesh Football Federation]. It is a privilege to have them with us but more importantly it's an effort to put pressure on them so that they can bring back popularity of our football," said Chowdhury while he was introducing BFF's senior vice-president Salam Murshedy, vice-president Kazi Nabil Ahmed and member Satyajit Das Rupu on the dais. It was understandably a promotional
