HIJACK ON HIGHWAYS

Transport owners demand security

Ask govt to act on their demand in 3 months

Rampant incidents of hijacking of goodsladen vehicles through killing drivers and helpers on highways have left vehicle owners, businessmen and transport leaders deeply worried.

Their frustrations deepen as neither are the looted goods and transport recovered nor are the criminals arrested. Worse, police often refuse to take cases in these connections.

More than 400 drivers and helpers of goods-laden trucks and covered vans are killed by robbers and goods worth around

Tk 200 crore are hijacked on the highways every year, claimed vehicle owners and leaders of transport organisations yesterday.

Owners and transport leaders of Dhaka and Chittagong at a press conference at Chittagong Press Club also accused the law enforcers of being reluctant to move against the criminals and harassing the victims.

They placed a 16-point demand, giving the government a three-month ultimatum to fulfill them. They warned that they would wage a "tougher movement" should the government fail to meet the demands.



FURNACE OIL SCAM

The committee for sale of furnace oil of state-run Padma Oil Company Ltd has been flouting its parent company Bangladesh Petroleum Corporation's (BPC) instructions regarding approval for delivering the fuel to different companies, said a BPC official yesterday.

The committee's non-adherence to the guidelines gave rise to a nexus of corruption in Padma Oil centring sale of furnace oil, said the official on condition of anonymity.


