







4 opposition MPs released on bail

Jamaat MP, 12 BNP leaders of Ctg get bail

Four of the five 18-party alliance lawmakers, who are the accused in an arson case, were released from jail last evening following a High Court bail.

Of them, BNP standing committee member MK Anwar and Joint Secretary General Mahbub Uddin Khokon walked out of Dhaka Central Jail around 6:30pm while Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) President Oli Ahmed and Bangladesh Jatiya Party (BJP) President Andalib

Rahman Partha from Kashimpur-2 Jail around 7:30pm.

The HC on Sunday granted the four and BNP's Student Affairs Secretary Shahid Uddin Chowdhury Anne six-week advance interim bail so that they could attend the ongoing budget session of the parliament.

But Anne was not released as he was accused in another case filed with Dhanmondi Police Station on June 8 last year, said Forman Ali, senior superintendent of Kashimpur-2 Jail.

Santu for visible progress in CHT deal implementation STAFF CORRESPONDENT


The situation in



Libya sends back 200 workers

Says visas fake; manpower office rejects it

The Libyan authorities have deported around 200 Bangladeshi job seekers in the last few days, saying their work visas were fake, but the manpower bureau in Dhaka has rejected the allegation.

The deportation starting from May 22 to 26 prompted the authorities in Dhaka not to allow the job seekers to go to Libya for now.

"There could be over 190 job seekers deported. But I don't see any reason

behind it (deportation) because their visas were issued by the Libyan embassy in Dhaka. We have even re-checked those," said Begum Shamsunnahar, director general of the Bureau of Manpower Employment and Training (BMET).

Contacted on Sunday, she said, "When recruiting agencies submitted their passports with visas seeking emigration clearance from us, we sent a list of those visas to the Libyan embassy for SEE PAGE 19 COL 2

Unipay2u director held for swindling



Police yesterday arrested a director of Unipay2u Bangladesh, a controversial multi-level marketing (MLM) company, from Uttara in the capital on charges of swindling people.

Maj (retd) Khondoker Mukit Al Mahmud, a director of the MLM company, was arrested at about 1:00 am after some aggrieved investors of Unipay2u caught him in front of his Uttara residence, said Shihab Uddin, subinspector at Mohammadpur Police Station.

The Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court placed Mukit on a nine-day remand after police produced him before the court and sought 22-day remand for him in connection with three cases filed for fraud and swindling people.
