Largest limestone reserve discovered

GSB sees it as feasible mine

The Geological Survey of Bangladesh yesterday discovered a limestone deposit in Panchbibi upazila of Joypurhat.

Moonira Akhter Chowdhury, Director General, Geological Survey of Bangladesh, told The Daily Star that the limestone deposit

appears to be the largest discovered so far in the country. Limestone is a key ingredient for making cement and Chowdhury believes that if the deposit is as big as the indicators are saying, it

could meet the demand for limestone in Bangladesh. Bangladesh depends largely on imported limestone.

"On the basis of scientific indications we can say that this is going to be a much bigger deposit than the old find in Jamalganj of Joypurhat and hopefully, it will also be feasible to mine," the DG said over the telephone.



TIPAIMUKH DAM

Farming, ecology at stake

When built, the Tipaimukh dam will result in damage to Boro production in the Sylhet region, causing a loss of over Tk 1,000 crore a year, experts have said.

In addition, the dam would be disastrous for the riverine ecology and biodiversity of the region, according to environment impact

assessment reports, including the Sixth Flood Action Plan (FAP), prepared by Bangladeshi experts.

A document titled "Comparison of discharge at Tipaimukh dam site (pre-dam and post-dam)" prepared by National Hydroelectric Power Company, India, shows water supply during lean season will increase from 282 to 537 cubic metres per second (cumec) at the India-Bangladesh border point after the construction

of the dam. Prepared in 2009 and officially handed over to Bangladesh parliamentarians, the document also shows the average discharge of water during the monsoon will decrease to 481 cumec from 854, which will improve the flood situation in the Sylhet region.
