

Bangladeshi driver dies in NY road crash

A Bangladeshi taxicab driver was killed when his cab was rammed by a truck in New York on Saturday.

Mohammad Hossain, 44, of Lauta village in Beanibazar upazila of Sylhet, left behind his widow and two children.

Family sources said while going to Manhattan from JFK airport, he lost control of the steering when a sports car tried to overtake him. He swerved off the lane and a garbage truck rammed the cab from behind.

Injured Hossain and the passenger were rushed to a hospital where doctors declared them dead.

Fire breaks out at power plant

Five workers wounded

Five workers sustained burn injuries when a fire broke out at Ghorashal thermal power plant in Narsingdi yesterday morning.

Four of the injured were identified as Abdul Ahad, 26, Riaz Uddin, 25, Babul, 25, and Al Amin, 24. The identity of the other worker could not be known immediately.

The fire originated at around 10:00am from the circuit breaker of a generator, which the workers were repairing. Akhtarrul Islam, chief engineer of the power plant, told The Daily Star.

The injured were taken to Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

PM stresses power conservation again

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday reminded ministers and top government officials of her earlier directive on power conservation.

At the weekly cabinet meeting, she told them to set the air conditioners in their offices above 25 degrees Celsius to save power. It was a prompt reaction when she noticed some ministers in suit and tie in this hot summer, Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury told The Daily Star.

The PM also advised them to wear summer clothes to work. When the whole country is experiencing an acute power shortage, they should set examples of careful use of power for others to follow, Hasina said at the meeting.

Speaking further on the issue, she said people in Japan and Singapore wore light clothes at work and fixed the temperature in

air conditioners above 25 degrees Celsius to save power.

Hasina also asked the ministers and lawmakers to be sincere about joining parliament regularly and to make the House more vibrant, said Matia, also a member of the ruling Awami League Presidium.

The cabinet had a discussion on power generation from waste. As a by-product, this power generation will make waste management easier and save the environment from pollution.

Primarily, Chittagong and Rajshahi will be considered for setting up of waste-based power plants. Sources in the cabinet quoted Forest and Environment Minister Hasan Mahmud as saying that some foreign countries like Sweden and Italy had shown interest in setting up such power plants in Bangladesh.

Khokan shown arrested in bus driver killing case

BNP leader Khairul Kabir Khokan was shown arrested yesterday in a case filed for killing a bus driver by torching his vehicle on April 21, in the capital's Khilgaon, on the eve of a hartal.

Police also sought a 10-day remand to interrogate him about the incident.

Fourth Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Saifur Rahman fixed June 12 for the hearing on the remand prayer and asked the police to submit a progress report of investigation into the case.

The court also sent Khokan to prison and asked the jail authorities to produce him before the court for the next hearing.

Khokan was first arrested on May 17 during the opposition-called hartal protesting an order sending 33 BNP leaders including its acting secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir to jail.

He was re-arrested on Sunday outside the gates of Dhaka Central Jail right after he was released on bail in another case filed for setting a vehicle ablaze on April 19 in front of BNP central office at Nayapaltan.

In the remand prayer, Moksedur Rahman, sub-inspector of Khilgaon Police Station and investigation officer (IO) of the case, said Khokan was "indirectly involved" in the death of the bus driver.

Moreover, the arrestees who were earlier detained revealed clues about Khokan's involvement with the killing, the IO said.

Bus driver Badar Ali Beg, 48, was burned alive while he was asleep inside his bus that set alight in front of Khidmoh Hospital on the afternoon of April 21.

After the incident, Khilgaon police filed a murder case accusing 31 leaders and activists of BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami of which police has so far arrested eight people including three Jamaat leaders.
