It was very unfortunate to criticise a highly respected personality like Prof Sayeed on the basis of newspaper reports which proved unfounded, Shawkat told journalists.

Eminent citizens have expressed the view that it was not a matter to discuss in the House and the lawmakers should have verified his statement before criticising him.

A section of the alliance MPs demanded that Prof Sayeed offer an unconditional apology in the House for his reported comment.

They claimed that he termed MPs and ministers "thieves and dacoits" at a Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) programme in the capital on

Saturday.

Founder of Bishwa Sahitya Kendra Prof Sayeed told The Daily Star yesterday that he did not make such remarks. Rather, he was upset to see the parliamentarians slamming him without checking or verifying his statement.

"I didn't say anything about parliament or members of parliament or ministers at the programme," he said. The MPs should have checked the facts before discussing the matter, added Prof Sayeed, also a Trustee Board member of TIB.

Talking to journalists after a discussion at the ministers' hostel at parliament building complex, the deputy speaker said, "Before we asked him, Prof Abu Sayeed himself made it clear that he did not make such

comment." Then why there was such reaction in parliament since the allegation was unfounded, he added.

The deputy speaker said he would have stopped the discussion if he was in the chair at that time. It resulted from misunderstanding and "we all should forget it".

Later, Shawkat said in parliament yesterday a statement of

Prof Sayeed was discussed in the house on Sunday. A few MPs spoke about it. Prof Sayeed in a statement published in the daily Samakal yesterday clarified that he did not make any such comment, which was published in the daily Ingilab.

The deputy speaker also said Prof Sayeed, if he wants, can go to the Press Council or take legal action against the newspaper.

Contacted, renowned educationist Prof Serajul Islam Choudhury said the matter was not something that had to be discussed in parliament.

It was not right to discuss in the House a matter which Prof Sayeed did not talk about, he said. It reflected the lack of

tolerance in political culture, Serajul Islam observed. Asked, TIB Executive

Director Iftekharuzzaman said the statement of Prof Sayeed should have been reviewed first before making any comment on him in parliament. "We'll exercise our right

to freedom of expression. We'll even sacrifice our blood to protect the right of our critics to criticise us. That promotes democracy," he said.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's visit to Delhi, Bangladesh was supposed to provide a one-shot transit to India to transfer equipment for its Palatana power plant. We gave this facility to India," Rahmatullah pointed out.

"But then using the same commitment we let them set up a temporary transfer facility and transfer billets for steel mills in Tripura and other goods as well. This was not supposed to happen. So why did we allow India to do it?" he asked.

He was also of a strong opinion that it is a wrong policy to look for favours from India by foregoing legitimate fees for transit.

But mysteriously, some Bangladeshi policymakers are not so interested to slap fees on transit, and instead look for other kinds of favours from India.

of Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS), private investment against GDP fell by 0.37 percentage point and stood at 19.14 percent in the current fiscal year.

During the last two decades, private investment marked a fall only in two years -- in the current fiscal year and in fiscal 2009, according to available statis-The overall investment

rose by 0.30 percentage point and reached 25.45 percent of GDP in the current fiscal year. The rate was 25.15 percent last year.

However, the overall investment rate missed the target set in the sixth fiveyear plan of the government. In fiscal 2012, the overall investment rate against GDP will be 26.8 percent.

Independent think tank the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) and the World Bank identified some reasons behind the fall in private investment.

In the Executive Opinion Survey 2012, which was carried out by the CPD during February-April this year, top three problematic factors are found to be increasingly becoming more important factors for businesses.

Poor infrastructure is

regarded as the most important problematic factor followed by high level of corruption, the think tank said in a report -- Review of parliament proceedings. No Bangladesh Economy in fiscal 2011-2012.

Difficulty with regard to 'access to finance' is the third most problematic factor. These adversities are likely to cause high cost of production with consequent guage, leading to the recurrence of similar incidents in negative implication for competitiveness of business both in local and foreign

> markets, said the report. Distinguished Fellow of the CPD Debapriya Bhattacharya said corruption and a lack of access to

finance were less important factors in the previous years. But these two factors have come to the fore this year.

The comments of Bhattacharya came while launching the report at the CPD office in Dhaka yester-

However, the WB in a report released on Sunday said: "Investors appear to have gone into a wait-andsee mode because of volatilities in the global economic environment and the stresses and strains emanating from domestic sources."

The domestic reasons include high variability in inflation, and tightening credit conditions in the financial sector as reflected in a significant reduction in growth in industrial term loan disbursement, resulting in negative net disbursements.

The WB also blamed the slowdown in private investment on energy shortages and policy uncertainties in the run-up to elections in early 2014.

Though private investment fell compared to GDP, public investment rose by around 1 percentage point.

According to BBS estimate, in the current fiscal year public investment against GDP has been put at 6.30 percent, which was 5.64 percent last fiscal year.

The CPD said the monetary policy stance taken by the central bank to control inflation will result in a slowdown in investment.

It also said the current macroeconomic performance including the monetary policy stance would entail investment slowdown leading to a trade-off in economic growth. The most direct measure

of deceleration of investment is exposed by decreasing trend in industrial term loan disbursement, the think tank added.

According to Bangladesh

months of the current fiscal year industrial term loan increased by only 1.94 percent, but the rise was about 34 percent in the same period last year.

Bank statistics, in the first six

According to LC (letter of credit) settlement statistics, capital machinery import growth in the first nine months of the current fiscal year fell by about half compared to the same period last vear.

In the first nine months, LC settlement for capital machinery import rose by 22 percent, while the growth was 43 percent in the same period last year.

A negative scenario in LC opening shows that future investment would suffer some setbacks. In the first nine months of

the current fiscal year, import of capital machinery fell by 26 percent, which increased by 69 percent during the same period last year. In the same way, import

of raw materials decreased and the extent of LC opening has also marked a fall. An official of a private

bank said the central bank has taken various steps to bring down private sector credit growth. As a result, the rate of

interest has also gone up in the recent times. He said these have also contributed to a slowdown in private investment.

Also, the overall electricity and gas crisis also stunted investment growth. The CPD report said,

despite some positive development in gas and electricity supply, the overall situation is still not supportive of new investment, particularly in the industrial sector.

The report also said, "The realised investment performance in fiscal 2011-12 will be to a great extent influenced by the unsatisfactory state of affairs in the energy sector.'
