United Airways to restart Ctg-Kolkata flights

United Airways (BD) Limited, a private airline, will restart flights on Chittagong-Kolkata route from June 18.

It will carry passengers from Hazrat Shah Amanat International Airport, Chittagong, says a release.

Weekly three flights will be operated on Friday, Monday and Wednesday.

The flights will depart from Chittagong at 1230 hrs. The one way special fare for Chittagong-Kolkata is Tk 9,815 and return fare is Tk 19,110 (inclusive of all taxes).



VISIT TO TIPAIMUKH SITE

Journalists return with only bird's eye view

Ten Bangladeshi journalists, who went to visit the Tipaimukh dam site on the Barak river in India's northeastern Manipur state on June 6, only got a bird's eye view as the helicopter carrying them could not land.

"The Indian Air Force (IAF) said that the helipad at Tipaimukh is not fit for landing of the chopper. Therefore, the team could not visit the site," said Ranjan Mandal, media liaison officer of the central ministry of external affairs to Times of India on June 7.

In July 2009, a Bangladeshi parliamentary delegation led by Abdur Razzak, on a fact-finding mission arranged by the Dhaka and Delhi

governments, met a similar fate when heavyrains barred their landing.

The Times of India ran a report headlined "Bangladeshi scribes' dam mission fails to take off" in its Guwahati issue on June 8.

The report said the Indian government flew the journalists' to the site on an IAF helicopter from Silchar airport at Kumbhirgram, Assam on June 6.

But the copter could not land at Tipaimukh due to "technical reasons", said the report.

The next morning, the journalists once again expressed their keenness to visit Tipaimukh, situated at a distance of 78 kilometres from Silchar hotel and 100 kilometres from Manipur's capital Imphal. But the IAF authorities failed to take

them to the spot for the same reasons as the previous day, read the report. However, the journalists had an opportunity to look at the congruence point of the Barak and Tuivai rivers and the Tipaimukh dam site

from 1,200 feet above the ground for over 20 minutes during the 70minute chopper ride, it said. Sources told the Times of India that the journalists understood that India

was yet to make any construction at the proposed site, added the report.

The journalists, led by Bangladesh Foreign Affairs Publicity Wing Deputy

via Kolkata on the afternoon of June 7. They arrived in Dhaka on June 8. Earlier, they had met Union Water

NISHAT KILLING Detectives suspect hitmen aimed to kill mother too

Detectives suspect that the three unidentified men who strangled Nishat Banu before her mother in their Topkhana residence in the capital on the night of June 5 were hired to murder the duo.

"The elderly woman is lucky to be alive," Inspector Fazlur Rahman of Detective Branch (DB), the investigation officer of the case, told The Daily Star last evening.

"The criminals might have been hired to kill the duo. After beating the mother, they might have left her for dead," he said. The criminals looted Tk

35,000 and six of Nishat's property deeds and left the tied up 76-year-old mother, Khaleda Banu, beside Nishat's body at around 3:30am on June 6. With no one within

hearing distance, nearly a day and a half went by before Khaleda was able to untie the cloth binding her and call out to the neighbours for help. Yesterday, DB personnel

detained four staff of Appayan Restaurant, adjoining the building where the murder took place. The detainees are the

restaurant's manager Pankaj Dey and staff Zaman, Alauddin and Khokan. Earlier, Khaleda had told

police that she suspected two brothers, who grabbed her property 20 years ago and built the restaurant on it, had planned the murder to seize her remaining properties. The brothers, Selim

Talukdar and Saiful Talukdar, the restaurant's owners, were detained by DB personnel on Thursday.

Meanwhile, the murder case Khaleda filed with Shahbagh Police Station on Thursday accusing the brothers and three unidentified people has been transferred to DB.



New probe body Two housewives kill themselves

Two housewives allegedly committed suicide by hanging themselves in the capital's Jatrabari and Mirpur areas yesterday.

In an incident, Rahela Begum, 20, wife of Shamsul Haque of Jatrabari, hanged herself from a ceiling fan in her room around 10:00am following a family feud, said Mazharul Islam, inspector for investigation at Jatrabari Police Station. Quoting relatives of Rahela, Mazharul following a family feud.

said, "Abuses by her husband and his family members might provoke her to commit suicide." Nasima Begum, elder sister of Rahela,

told The Daily Star that private car driver Shamsul married to Rahela five years back. But Shamsul used to beat her regularly for various reasons.

"Shamsul made a phone call to me yesterday night [Friday night], and said that he will divorce Rahela as he can not tolerate her. This morning, I came to know that my sister committed suicide," she said.

Nasima filed a suicide provocation case accusing Shamsul, his brother Mahbubul Haque and their mother Parul Begum with Jatrabari Police Station in this connection.
